*Minutes of Council Meeting Monday 20<sup>th</sup> June, 2016  
10.30 am, 222 Pitt Street Sydney*

**OPENING:** Past President, Tricia Graham, introduced President Pamela Freeman to the Council meeting. Pamela welcomed all to the meeting, with a special welcome to Sister Judith Clark, visiting with Carmel Keys.

**DEVOTIONS:** Pamela shared readings from Psalms quoted from the book of Jonah, Chapter 2, when Jonah prayed to God while inside the fish. When Jonah had come to a crisis, he reverted to the words familiar to him from the Psalms and other parts of the Old Testament. He went to those words that he had learnt in his youth. He prayed a set prayer that he had been taught, his prayer has been kick-started by his plight, though it has not been reduced to that situation. His prayer took him into a world far larger than his immediate experience. His prayer reflected how large and great God is, and acknowledged the one with whom he was dealing. May we be encouraged to continue memorising passages of scripture that are to be hidden in our hearts, and may be drawn upon in the times of crisis, threats and uncertainty. Pamela closed the Devotions with prayer.

### **BUSINESS ARISING FROM THE MINUTES:**

**1. Essay Competition:** Information has been received from the ACW National Executive regarding the Essay Competition for 2016. This information has been forwarded to the school represented at the Dedication Day, OLMC Parramatta, also to Toongabbie Christian School.

**2 Dedication Day:** Comments received indicate that this was an uplifting and happy service. The music of the Salvation Army band, the OLMC music group and choir were most enjoyable.

**3 Archives:** Lyn Middleton reported that Isabel has started looking at NSW documents. Lyn is still going through Winifred Kiek up to 1970. This is a work in progress.

### **REPORTS:**

**Treasurer:** Pat Cory presented the Statement of Receipts and Payments 1<sup>st</sup> April – 31<sup>st</sup> May 2016. Total Income for April and May: \$1149.09; Total Payments for April & May \$726.23, giving a Credit Balance at 31<sup>st</sup> May 2016 of \$2699.49.

**Fellowship of the Least Coin** –No Report

**Special Days:** Lyn Middleton gave her good wishes to everyone planning Fellowship Day in July. Branch representatives present gave details of their services. Elizabeth will send this information to Brenda to be placed on the website. Materials have been received for WCD and these will be ready at the next meeting in August or mailed out. The theme is 'Empowered by the Spirit' – a celebration of 60 years of FLC. The 2016 Special Project is Seeds of Affinity. This project involves working with Aboriginal women prisoners in Adelaide Women's Prison, teaching skills via peer training from Seeds of Affinity participants. Lyn commented that this is a good project worthy of our support.

**Winifred Kiek Scholarship:** There is a new WKS pamphlet with the new scholar, Esline. Christy Ferguson (Melb. 2009) is now in SE Asia for short-term mission. On arrival the creative event with many villages attending ranged from percussion through to business sessions. She is getting to know the Community Development Organization. Christy has done training sessions on TB and immunisation. There have been recent deaths from TB. She has been involved with bike-rides, tropical storms, a wedding, and catching up with old friends. Christy asks for continued prayer and that she would be used by the Father for His glory. Leinamau (Vanuatu 2007) is on a 3 week break (Bible College, Fiji). Busy revising the Hebrew she has learnt last semester. 'She is good and happy, also putting on weight, due to more study and less play and work. The 2016 Scholar Esline will be using the Funds of the scholarship to accept an invitation to attend World Churches of Christ Convention in January 2017 in New Delhi, India. The theme is to be 'God tears down walls to build bridges' from Ephesians 2:20-21. Judith thanked Council members for their partnership with scholars past and present.

**Social Issues:** Rae provided form letters to: Justice Peter Johnson expressing support for sentencing of persons involved in female genital mutilation; The Deputy Prime Minister, Julie Bishop – concern about cutting foreign aid budget; and Michaelia Cash, Minister for Employment and Women, support for Government's plan for child care costs.

**Membership:** Martha Noel commented that falling numbers at Council meetings are becoming a concern. She encouraged Council Members to invite new people to join.

**Pastoral Care:** June Kay reported that a sympathy card had been sent to Roger and Jennifer Pepper on the death of Roger's brother; a card also sent to Roger and Jennifer congratulating them on their 50<sup>th</sup> wedding anniversary. June also sent a sympathy card to the family of Pat Sutton and wrote to Jean Porteus on her move to Mittagong.

**Newsette:** Jennifer requested articles and reports by 6<sup>th</sup> July and requested that comments be emailed to her regarding Dedication Day. Reminders have been sent to those who have not renewed their subscription and the option given of receiving Newsette by email. There has been some response – some have said they are too old to read now. Postage costs will be less because a number will be receiving Newsette by email.

**Publicity:** Pamphlets were handed out for the ACWC Concert of Praise on Sunday 21<sup>st</sup> August at Epping Baptist Church, and for the State Day Conference on Monday 19<sup>th</sup> September at the Salvation Army, Granville. Pamela advised that some of the artists who have performed before will be there.

**Bible Society:** No report

**Girls' Brigade:** Elizabeth Neale presented the Girls' Brigade Report for June. Their Annual State Conference was held on 29<sup>th</sup> April – 1<sup>st</sup> May at Yarramundi. Jenny Fayth was voted in as State Coordinator. Pioneer Leadership Training was held on the weekend of 14<sup>th</sup> & 15<sup>th</sup> May. Pioneer Leadership Training was also held at Cootamundra in May. The GB have been creating and sending cards to Julie Bishop advocating for the release and return of the girls captured in Nigeria. Elizabeth outlined her experience at the Pacific Conference held in Auckland in April. Five countries attended the conference: Australia, Cook Islands, New Zealand, Niue and PNG. The Commissioning of Renelle Neale (Elizabeth's mother) as new International Vice President took place.

**NSW Ecumenical Council:** No Report

**National Council of Women (NCW):** Tricia attended the Jean Arnot Luncheon at Parliament House where Anna Bligh, former Premier of Queensland, was the speaker. The morning tea to celebrate 100 years of NCW will be held on Tuesday 28<sup>th</sup> June. The Foundation Day Lunch will be held at Parliament House on 8<sup>th</sup> August – recognition awards will be presented to persons who have worked to advance the status of women, but who have not yet been recognised. The Members and Friends morning tea is on the first Wednesday of each month in the Upper Room Café.

**Pan Pacific & South East Asia Women's Association (PPSEAWA):** Minutes from their meeting of 25<sup>th</sup> May were received. The guest speaker was from OzHarvest, a voluntary organisation which operates through the generosity of people, funding and donations and is the first perishable food rescue organisation in Australia that collects quality excess food from more than 2000 commercial outlets and delivers it, direct and free of charge, to more than 800 charities.

#### **OTHER BUSINESS:**

1) **State Website Manager:** Pamela had a discussion with Brenda regarding this position, which Brenda wanted to clarify, as it was listed with 'Committees' on AGM Agenda, but is not a committee. The Website Manager does not need to be on the Executive, but be separate from Committees. They looked at ways that the website could be used and information has been sent through Brenda for ACWC Concert and for the Day Conference in September, and also information about Fellowship Day Services.
