ALL: As individuals of diverse religious traditions, we
join together in our shared concern.

LEADER: Let us hear our children; let us celebrate their
presence with thanks. Let us commit ourselves to
achieve for them the rights they need for life.

ALL: Millions of children are hungry and sick.
We reaffirm their 'Right to adequate nutrition and
medical care'.

LEADER: Many grow up in ignorance. We reaffirm their 'Right
to a Free Education'.

ALL: Thousands are bound to labor which stunts their
growth. We reaffirm their 'Right to full opportunity
for play and recreation'.

LEADER: There are those who are nameless and rootless. We
reaffirm their 'Right to a home and nationality'.

ALL: Some who are handicapped struggle alone. We
reaffirm their 'Right to special care if handicapped'.

LEADER: Children suffer first in disaster and suffer most.
We reaffirm their 'Right to be among the first to
receive relief in times of disaster'.

ALL: Young people often cannot find a place to be and grow.
We reaffirm their 'Right to be a useful member of
Society and to develop individual abilities.

LEADER: Many do not know the embrace of kin.
We reaffirm their 'Right to affection, love and understanding'.

ALL: Children are often innocent victims of violence and hatred. We reaffirm their 'Right to be brought up in a spirit of peace and universal brotherhood'.

LEADER: Wherever they are, children are our responsibility and joy. We reaffirm their 'Right to enjoy these rights regardless of race, colour, sex, religion national or social origin'.

ALL: For all these rights of children who are the future of humanity on this planet Earth; and for the transcendent privilege to hope to dream and to believe that life has meaning,
