## RECTOR'S REPORT TO THE VESTRY MEETING

"It is required in stewards that a man be found faithful." 1 Corinthians 4:2

1985 was a rather difficult year. Congregation wise we had many sick and not a few deaths, the winter was harsh and the ministry to the sick and sorrowing quite demanding. Opportunities for outreach seemed to dry up and generally it was a year without much prospect.

It was midway through the year we decided to seek a student worker to encourage an outreach to youth. This took much prayer and planning. It didn't appear possible even at the end of 1985, but the Lord's plan was different from ours and we are thankful to have the services of Peter Janda for this year. We also welcome his wife Sue and their family too. The truth is that they sought us. Their rector suggested they worship at Petersham while they studied at Moore College in preparation for missionary service.

This year I have felt the need of directing more attention towards the hospitals and nursing homes within the parish. This attention has been further encouraged by subsequent events.

All Saints' Petersham, will maintain its ministry to people with special emphasis towards youth and the aged-sick. Prayer support will be essential for this work to be successful.

It will be necessary for our church services to be vital and relevant to the needs of people. Age or strength of limb is no restriction to sharing in worship which is alive and personal. A prayer life should be the aim of every parishioner. It will be hard work to begin but I can promise it will achieve much more than any other activity you have ever taken part in.
