Australian Church Women forms a network of committed Christian women dedicated to encourage fellowship and service across denominational, national and international boundaries.

Winifred Kiek Scholarship

Leader: Be joyful in the Lord, all you lands;

Leader: Our gracious Heavenly Father, we bring to you our gifts from willing hearts. Reading: adapted from John 6:25–40

Leader: When the people saw Jesus on the other side of the lake, they said to him:

Reader 1: Teacher!

Reader 2: When did you get here?

Jesus: I tell you the truth, you are looking for me, not because you saw miraculous signs but because you ate the loaves and had your fill. Do not work for food that spoils, but for food that endures to eternal life, which the Son of Man will give you. On him God the Father has placed his seal of approval.

Reader 1: What must we do to do the works God requires?

Jesus: The work of God is this: to believe in the one he has sent.

Reader 2: What miraculous sign then will you give that we may see it and believe you?

Reader 1: What will you do? Our forefathers ate manna in the desert; as it is written; he gave them bread from heaven to eat.

Jesus: I tell you the truth, it is not Moses who has given you the bread from heaven, but it is my Father who gives you the true bread from heaven. For the bread of God is he who comes down from heaven and gives life to the world.

Readers 1 & 2: Sir, from now on give us this bread.

Jesus: I am the bread of life. He who comes to me will never go hungry, and he who believes in me will never be thirsty. But as I told you, you have seen me and still you do not believe. All that the father gives me will come to me, and whoever comes to me I will never drive away. For I have come down from heaven not to do my will but to do the will of him who sent me. And this is the will of him who sent me, that I shall lose none of all that he has given me, but raise them up at the last day. For my Father's will is that everyone who looks to the Son and believes in him shall have eternal life, and I will raise him up at the last day.

Leader: As you fed your people of old, feed today those who hunger to hear your Good News of grace and forgiveness.

All: *Loving God, hear our prayer.*

Leader: We pray for those in trouble and distress; for the friendless and unwanted; for those who are frail, ill or confused.

All: *Father, make us agents of your transforming grace and in your mercy, hear us.*
