HOLY WEEK:

In this sacred week we are called upon to commemorate the sorrows that wrought our salvation and to rejoice in the triumph that issued from them in the victory over the Cross and the Sepulchre. If we would enter more fully into the "mind of Christ" we should make this week a time of self-denial and self-examination, we should *watch* with Him and *pray*.

This is the great WEEK of the Church's year. We earnestly invite you to make an effort to attend the special services that are provided in YOUR OWN CHURCH, when the services will be such as to bring us to a more grateful recognition of His love, Who "was wounded for *our* transgressions and bruised for our iniquities."

At ALL SAINTS' Church the services will be:—

DAILY, 11 a.m., Matins, Ante-Communion and Address.

7.45 p.m., Evensong. Address. "The Story of the Cross."

WEDNESDAY, 7.45 p.m., SPECIAL SERVICE OF PREPARATION FOR HOLY COMMUNION to which all communicants are urgently invited.

GOOD FRIDAY:

Will be marked by cessation of ordinary work as on Sunday. Why? Surely for this reason, and this alone, that the Crucifixion of our Lord and Saviour may be kept in remembrance by the observance of this day. And how shall we keep it? Surely not by making it a day of mere pleasure, enjoyment and recreation! If the day is regarded at all it should be "regarded unto the Lord," and used as a time of drawing closer to Him. How will you use the day? Will you endeavour to attend the services which will be as follows?

EASTER DAY.

Every Sunday is observed as a holy day in weekly commemoration of the Resurrection of our Lord, and Easter Day is the great yearly festival of the Resurrection, the greatest of all the festivals of the Church, as it commemorates a fact that is the very foundation truth of our Christianity.

On such a day surely our services should be especially joyful and triumphant, and that not merely in the character of words and tunes we use, but in the hearts of the worshippers themselves.

This is the one day that our Prayer Book mentions as *the day* on which all Christians ought to *join together* in the great "sacrifice of praise and thanksgiving" in the Holy Communion.
