

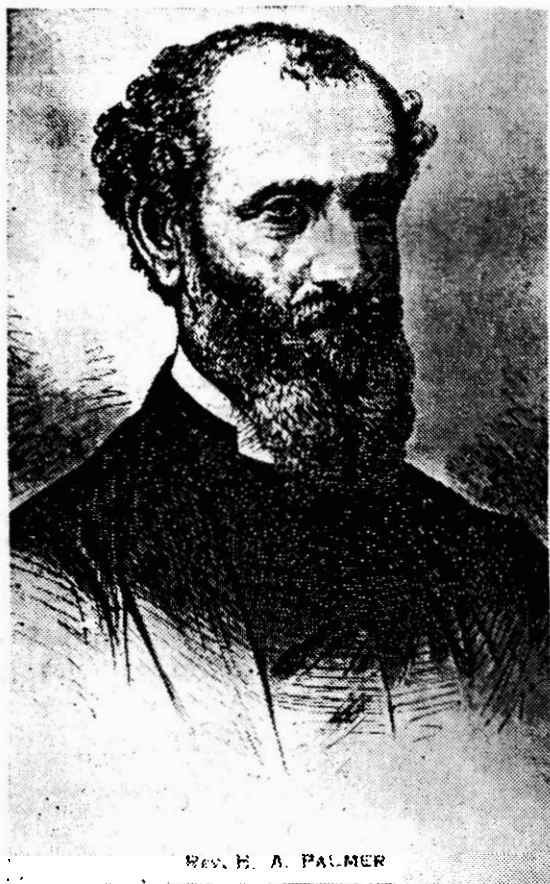

Dear Friends,

The Church Year is divided into two halves. In the first half our attention is directed to the life of Christ. There is an emphasis on the facts surrounding Jesus birth, His temptations in the wilderness, His death and resurrection, His ascension and the coming of the Holy Spirit.

The first half of the Church Year reminds us of the facts associated with the life of Christ. It is a historic record of the life on earth of a unique person, who was both man and God.

These facts are told that we might believe them to be true and acknowledge that this Jesus Christ came to be our Saviour and Lord. It is a story told in order that we might choose to follow Him.

The second half of the Church Year - or as we call it Trinity (or the Sundays after Trinity) - this part of the year the emphasis is how we should live as followers of this God -man, known as Jesus Christ.

We are now in the season of Trinity and as you Sunday by Sunday come to worship at All Saints' church you will notice the emphasis is on christian Living.

A couple of days ago I was reading an article in a newspaper in which the father of the family was chastising his son (a teenager) for his atheistic opinions. The lad was saying "There is no god - there can't be any god".

The father couldn't understand why his son should take this attitude.

The son's answer was simple, "Dad you don't behave any differently from other people, people who don't claim to be christians."

It is a sobering thing to be told - "Your deeds don't match your words"- or "You don;t practice what you preach".

It's grateful that in our Anglican church we have that balance. We are encouraged to learn about Christ. We are Sunday by Sunday taught that facts about His life. We are carefully instructed so that we may know we can put our trust in Him.

Having been thus carefully led to know Jesus as Lord and Saviour we are then shown how a follower of the master should live.

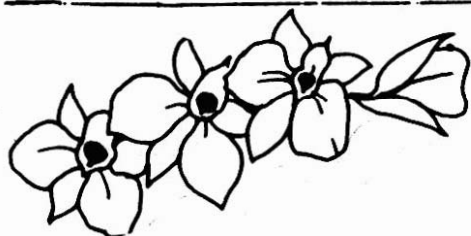

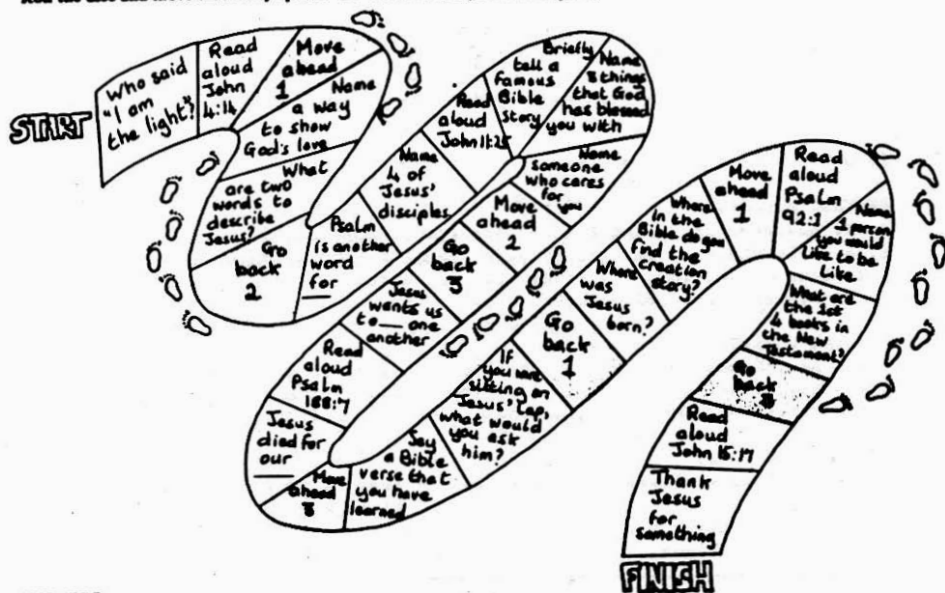
