Dear Friends,

TWELVE GOOD REASONS.

Frances Ridley Havergal, whose lovely hymns form a precious part of our sacred music, has these reasons for attending church.

1. God has blessed the Lord's Day and hallowed it, making no exception for hot or cold or stormy days.
2. I expect my minister to be there. I should be surprised if he were to stay at home on account of the weather.
3. By staying away I lose the prayers which may bring God's blessing, and the sermon which would have done me great good.
4. My presence is more needful on Sundays when there are fewer than those days when the church is crowded.
5. On any important business, rainy weather does not keep me at home, and church attendance is, in God's sight, very important.
6. Such weather will show me on what foundations my faith is built, it will prove how much I love Christ. True love rarely fails to meet an appointment.
7. Though my excuses satisfy myself, they must still undergo God's scrutiny; and they must be well grounded to do that.

8. There's a special promise that where two or three meet together in God's name, He will be there in the midst of them.

9. An avoidable absence from the church is infallible evidence of Spiritual decay. Disciples follow Christ first at a distance and then like Peter, they do not know Him. 10. My faith is to be shown by my self-denying Christian life, and not by the rise and fall of the barometer.

11. Such yielding to surmounting difficulties prepares for yielding to those merely imaginary, until thousands never enter a Church, and think they have good reasons for such neglect.

12. I do not know how many more Sundays God may give me, and it would be a poor preparation for my first Sunday in heaven to slighted my last Sunday on earth.
