The General Secretary of the Australian Council of Churches, Miss Jean Skuse, arranged for a dinner to be held at Caratis Christi Conference Centre, Wahroonga, on Tuesday, July 12.

Because of the numbers of "Christians One" members desirous of attending, some were unable to attend the dinner, but were able to join with the group of over 100 in the meeting room. Here they had the opportunity to share with supporters of the ecumenical movement the issues and concerns to be discussed at the forthcoming World Council of Churches' Assembly in Vancouver. Rev. David Gill, Secretary of the Assembly of The Uniting Church, was the main speaker. He had formerly been a staff member of the World Council in Geneva.

This Assembly is held every seven years. The Three-week event (July-August, 1983) will have as its theme: "Jesus Christ - the Life of the World."

ABC Radio will be programming weekly reports on the Assembly. Each Wednesday from July 27 - August 10, inclusive, "Journal of Religion" will be presented on Radio 2 and 3 at 7.15 p.m. The opening worship service will be broadcast on Radio 3 at 11.00 a.m. on Sunday July 31 and on the same day at 5 p.m. on Radio 2. Other programmes will also include reports of the Assembly - further details may be obtained from the ABC.
