Dear Readers,

Greetings. This is my first "Chronicle" message as Rector of All Saints'. I trust that you enjoyed Christmas and the New Year. As I write this my family and I have been at Petersham for one month. We have settled in quite well already - the Rectory is very spacious and comfortable, and we have spent time at Petersham Pool and the parks. It's quite a good area to live.

I have been reading up on the history of Petersham Anglican Church. One hundred & twenty three years is a long time, and many lives have come under the influence of the church's activities over the time. However, having had such a long and illustrious history can have some negatives today. What can develop, and I believe what is evident here at All Saints' to some degree, is a tendency to yearn for the good days of the past - to look back rather than ahead. Churches with a long and grand history can lose sight of their purpose for today and their vision for tomorrow. This is especially true in parishes where there has been tremendous change in the last twenty years. The "ethnic" population far outnumbers the Anglican, church attendances have dwindled, the church members are aging, finances are scarce, It can become depressing. So we look back at the past and sigh.

In the face of this, however, my desire is for our church to capture a vision for what we are to be. Then, to set about working to see that vision come to fruition.

Our vision will come from God. The means to bring it about will come from God. Therefore we need to be praying that God will send his Spirit upon us to enliven us and to work in and through us. We need to pray that the name of Jesus will be honoured and that his Kingdom will grow in Petersham and in all the world.

Next month I plan to outline in some detail a Vision for our church, and some goals and strategies which will move us towards seeing that vision materialise. In the meantime please pray for us, that God would be glorified in all we do, and that he will indeed fill us with the Holy Spirit and so equip us for the exciting challenges ahead.

Reclassification as a Provisional Parish.

We have received notification that as from 31 December 1993 our Parish has been made a Provisional Parish. Clause 8 (i) of the Parishes Ordinance 1979 determines that if a Parish cannot meet the cost of the Rector's stipend and statutory provisions for three consecutive years, from local revenues, then it becomes a Provisional Parish. This means that we lose the right of nomination and that we can have only one Synod representative from the laity. On the positive side however, the Diocesan assessments are reduced so that we pay only #356 in 1994 as against \$5460 in 1993.
