**All Saints' Church.**—SPECIAL SERVICES.—On Sunday 6th June, in fulfilment of a long-standing promise, the Rev. A. J. H. Priest, the well-known Missionary Missioner, will preach at the Morning and Evening Services and also at the Children's Service in the afternoon.

On Sunday 13th June Special Services of Intercession in reference to the present warfare will be held at 11 o'clock and 7.15. At the former service on this day the Petersham Rifle Club will attend. The surplus offertory will be devoted to the Belgian Fund. Similar services will be repeated on the second Sunday in each month.

**St. Augustine's Church.**—SPECIAL ANNIVERSARY SERVICES will be held on Sunday 6th June at St. Augustine's Church as follows:—

We feel sure that all who attend will be highly pleased with the excellent programme.

**Confirmation.**—The Archbishop of the Diocese will administer the sacred rite of Confirmation in this Parish in the Spring. Those who are desirous of attending the classes and lectures in preparation are asked to send in their names, and to attend the first preparatory lecture in All Saints' Church on Sunday 4th July at 4.15 p.m.

**All Saints' Church.**—DEDICATION OF MEMORIAL WALL AND ENTRANCE GATES.—Nearly five years ago the Jubilee of the first Church-of-England Service in Petersham, held in the year 1860, was commemorated by special Services and also by a Parochial gathering at the Town Hall. At this meeting it was resolved to make a permanent memorial of the event in the form of a fence on the Stanmore-Road frontage of the Church grounds. The Archbishop, who made his first visit to the parish on the occasion of this Jubilee, heartily commended the plan, and initiatory steps were at once taken. Subscriptions were invited and promised, the school-children contributing the cost of a children's gate. While funds were coming in Mr. Wippell, of the local branch of the Bank of Australasia, passed away, and Mrs. Wippell and her family offered to erect the main entrance gates in his memory. Saturday 29th May saw the somewhat delayed completion of this effort when his Grace the Archbishop dedicated the memorial wall and gates, the following Clergy also being present: Revs. Canon Martin, R. Noake, A. J. H. Priest, H. Crotty, H. G. J. Howe and R. Rook.

The Dedication Service commenced with the hymn: "All people that on Earth do dwell" during which the Choir, Clergy and Archbishop processed to the Main Entrance Gates where the Wardens presented the petition for dedication to the Archbishop in response to which his Grace dedicated the gates with appropriate prayers and read the following inscription which was unveiled by Mr. H. Wippell:—"To the Glory of God and in loving memory of Frederic Walter Wippell these Gates were erected by his Widow and Family—1915". Singing the Hymn: "O God, our Help in Ages past" the procession continued to the Children's Gate where the Wardens unveiled and read the inscription on the gateway and the Archbishop dedicated the memorial. The inscription reads thus: "To the Glory of God this Wall was erected by the Parishioners to commemorate the Jubilee of the First Service held in this Parish in 1860 this Gateway being the Gift of the School-children in the Year of the Jubilee 1910".

After the Service of Dedication Short Evensong was held in the Church the Archbishop giving a most helpful and inspiring address on the words of St. Paul: "Walk worthy of the Vocation wherewith ye are called!" The Service was attended by a large number of former and present parishioners including Mrs. Wippell and the members of her family. At the close of the Service a Social gathering of parishioners to meet the Archbishop was held in the School Hall at which the Rector in the name of those present thanked his Grace for marking by this Dedication Service the completion of the work which he had helped them to inaugurate on the occasion of his first visit to the parish. The Archbishop who was very warmly applauded responded to the thanks and expressed the hope that ere long he might be asked to lay the foundation stone of a new School Hall to replace the historic but inconvenient room in which they were meeting.

**Young Churchmen's Institute.**—On Friday 14th May the Y.C.I. had an interesting and instructive debate on the question: "Which is the most productive of Crime, Luxury or Poverty?" The case for luxury was conducted by Messrs. E. and R. Kinnings and Griffiths, that for poverty by Messrs. Quick, Calver, Weir and Bosward—the Chairman's casting vote carried the question in favour of poverty. The Institute meets fortnightly on Friday evenings. Young men of the parish are cordially invited to join.

**A Military Church Parade** was held in the grounds of St. Augustine's Church on Sunday afternoon, May 16, in memory of the late Lieutenant Williams who was for some years closely connected with the Church both as a Chorister and as a Sunday School Teacher, and who was among the first of our soldiers to fall at The Dardanelles. The Military numbering 150 Senior Cadets and 30 members of the Citizen Forces were present and the combined Militia and Senior Cadet Bands rendered assistance both on the march and during the singing of the special hymns. A very impressive address was delivered by the Rev. W. T. Prentice who chose as his text: "Quit yourselves like men and be strong!"

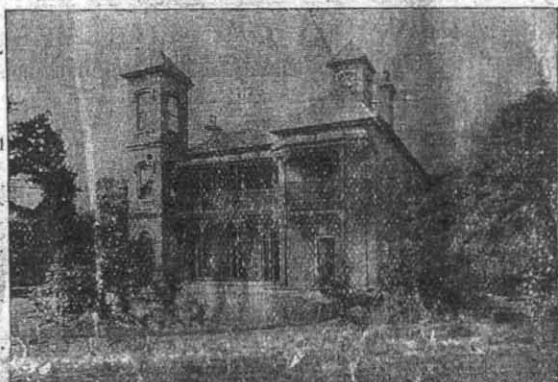
