THE WINIFRED KIEK SCHOLARSHIP

This Scholarship is intended for Christian women from Asian, Indian or Pacific areas, who already have basic training in a chosen field of work.

It provides the opportunity for further training and/or experience, to better equip the scholar to provide leadership in her own country, church and community. The scholarship covers fares, tuition fees and accommodation costs for a maximum of five months, and is awarded annually when possible. Preferred age for the scholar is 25-35 years.

FUNDS FELLOWSHIP

The offering received at the A.C.W. FELLOWSHIP DAY SERVICE, held in various centres in July each year, is invested, and the interest used to finance the scholarship.

THE 1995 SCHOLARS

MRS LILY POLITINI: is a Captain of the Salvation Army, 35 years of age, a Pastor's wife, and the mother of four sons. She works as an Assistant Training Officer at the Salvation Army School for Officer Training in Suva, Fiji.

Lily has been nominated by the Regional Commander and the Regional Director of Women's Organisations (Suva, Fiji) to attend the World Women's Christian Temperance Union 33rd Triennial World Convention in Melbourne, May 1995.

On her return to Fiji, she will begin an educational program on the effects of alcohol on family life. For a week following the Conference, the Victorian Unit of A.C.W. will enable Lily to visit various programs relating to drug and alcohol abuse.

MISS RACHEL ROLLAND: nominated by the Presbyterian Women's Mission Union of Vanuatu, requesting that Rachel attend a Women's Leadership Development Course at T.I.M.A.L. Training Centre Rabaul, P.N.G. for two months. She will become the P.W.M.U. Women's Worker for over 2000 women.

Unfortunately, because of volcanic eruptions near Rabaul in 1994, the course requested is not available in 1995. The P.W.M.U. in Vanuatu is seeking an alternative course in another Pacific country. When a suitable course is available, Rachel will take up this scholarship.

THE W.K.S. TRUSTEES

The Trustees of this Scholarship are situated in Adelaide, and are responsible for investing funds and acting as an advisory body to the National Executive.

THE WINIFRED KIEK SCHOLARSHIP

Funds will be made available triennially to provide fares, honoraria and accommodation costs for the recipient. She will tour Australia to speak to Church and community groups telling of her work amongst the women of her home country.

The purpose of this Fellowship is to promote knowledge and understanding, and to provide mutual inspiration for Australian women who are visiting, studying or residing in Australia.

AUSTRALIAN CHURCH WOMEN MEMORIAL BURSARY

A photograph and brief outline of the woman so honoured is then recorded in the Memorial Book. (Contact your unit treasurer for details).
