"ARMS.- Argent, a cross gules charged with five stars of six points sable? fimbriated of the field. In the first quarter a crozier in bend surmounted by an open book, in the second a dove holding in the beak a twig of olive, in the third two mimosa branches in saltire, and in the fourth on the sea a ship in full sail all proper.

The shield surmounted by a bishop's Mitre. Motto:- "Non Interiora Secuti" Latin:- Not striving after lower things.

Colours-- Purple and black."

The ship is said to be a representation of the ship that Thomas Moore came out from England in.

A reference is also made that the four stars of six points should have been four stars of eight points (argent) the same as the arms of the Diocese of Sydney, said to represent the Crux Australia or principal Constellation of the Southern Hemisphere.

Mimosa is the english name for our wattle.
