Jubilee Memorial.—The Wardens desire to acknowledge with thanks the receipt of several more promises of contributions to the proposed fence and gates on the Stanmore Road frontage of All Saints' Church, but the amount contributed or promised falls far short of even the most modest design which was offered to the meeting of parishioners. The Church Council therefore at its last meeting requested them to ask all who are disposed to share in this memorial to be good enough to send in their contributions or promises as early as possible so that the *list may be closed* at an early date in the present month.

All Saints' Church Council.—At the regular quarterly meeting, held on October 3, the Wardens presented their accounts which shewed a deficit of about £45. It was thought now that the rather long season of very prevalent and infectuous sickness was passing away there would be larger Sunday congregations again and consequently larger offertories. The resignation of Mr. John Day as a member of the Council in consequence of his removal from the Parish, was received with much regret. The Council advised the Wardens to make an urgent appeal for the Jubilee Memorial fence and gates.
