

Minutes of Meeting held in Board Room,
Bible House on Friday 30th May 1958.

In the absence of the President the Past President Mrs Gyarlick occupied the chair and there was an attendance of twenty eight members.

Mrs Gyarlick opened the meeting with prayer and members joined in the Lord's Prayer.

Apologies were received from Messdames Powell, Paterson, Hillman, ^{St. Peter's} Stimpewick, Weggen and Dean.

The minutes of the previous meeting were read and confirmed.

Business arising from Minutes:

- (1) Party for Elderly Migrants on July 14th.

Mrs Pearson reported that it had seemed desirable to arrange to have the party in the Presbyterian Club instead of the Congress Social Hall so that persons who wished to do so might smoke. Each denomination was asked to see that at least three representatives attended. Helpers were to bring cakes, pikelets, etc, flowers, a small tablecloth, and a tea towel and to arrive at about 1.30 p.m. Mrs Briggs moved and Mrs Hall seconded a motion that a small collection should be taken up to defray the cost of

tea, milk etc. This collection realised 15/10.

Members were also reminded of the party for migrants on June 28th at Anthony Hardin's Social Hall. Members able to attend gave their names to Mrs Pearson.

- (2) Arrangements for the Rally were then finalised. Miss Eastaway was asked to see if the notice of Rally could be put on St. Stephen's notice board on the Sunday preceding the Rally.

The Secretary reported that the Appeals and the Hostel committees had each agreed to pay one-third of the cost if the Annual Reports were printed. This would mean that the cost for the Inter Church Council would probably be less if the reports were printed than if they were reposed. Miss McDiarmid moved and Mrs Barrett seconded a motion that the reports be printed. Carried.

The number of reports to be not less than 500. The secretary to find out cost of having more reports and to decide, in consultation with Mrs Garlick, the number to be obtained. Mrs Deans moved and Mrs Barrett seconded a motion that the secretary should ask Mrs Coaldrake to speak at the Annual Community Day in September.

Notice was given of a meeting arranged,

by the W.C.T.U. for Friday 20 June 10.30 - 12.30
in the Assembly Hall when Col. Madge
Unsworth would speak.

The Treasurer's statement showing a credit
balance of £3.4.3 was presented.

As there was no further business the meeting
was closed and the Annual Meeting
followed.

The Secretary was asked to write to Mrs Wells
who is leaving Sydney to live in Adelaide
and to Mrs Wypers asking her to convey our
greetings to any groups of ^{church} women she may
meet on her visit to America.
