

GOD'S WORLD : OUR WORLD

Readings from the daily newspapers - our world as it is!

Voice from the congregation: *Let's not be so dismal. I don't come to church to think about things like that. I want to get away from them and think about God.*

Leader: But these headlines are our world, God's world. He is concerned in all this!

Voice: *Ye..s! But it's all so complicated. Is this the way the world is meant to be?*

Leader: We cannot avoid involvement in the world. God made us as the culmination of his creation, to have responsibility as stewards for all that He has made.

SCRIPTURE READING - Psalm 8

towards the world
confessing our apathy towards each other.

SCRIPTURE READING - Ephesians 1:3-14

AFFIRMATION OF HOPE (*all standing*)

Who sets us free to be ourselves.
Sharing his victory in life and death we are able to live
and die without fear.

live the life of love and forgiveness, teaching others that

LEADERS NOTES
"FELLOWSHIP DAY - 1975"

1. Form a planning group to develop this service to suit your congregation. Choose people for their reading ability etc. rather than because they're office bearers.
2. Form a small group, have a choir practice or use the tape recording of unfamiliar songs available to ensure the congregation has an idea of the songs to be used during the service.
3. Bible readings - recommend you use "Good News for Modern Man" translation to gain full benefit in understanding the readings selected. Psalm 8 - recommend you use "Psalms for Modern Man" in Today's English Version or "God is Here, Let's Celebrate" by Leslie Brandt, paraphrases on psalms.
4. Readings from the Newspaper - ask members of planning group to cut out headlines from the Newspapers which show the confusion and turmoil of the world, the abuse of creation and of man.
5. Voice from the congregation - this person could sit near the front with a microphone if necessary or wherever you find appropriate. She is as it were 'speaking the thoughts of the congregation' as the service progresses
6. Prayers - follow the headings suggested and write your own or select from suitable books. William Barclay has an excellent prayer on the Fruits of the Spirit in "Prayers for Today".
7. Meditation - have quiet organ music or taped music as background to the reading. Use one person to read or have three people verbally role play the reading. Let the music continue for a minute or so at the end for "reflection" time by the congregation.
8. Music - If you want to use modern hymns we suggest the following books:- Travelling to Freedom: Sing a New Song: Songs of Faith: Faith, Folk & Festivity.
The following hymns and songs are recommended - if unsuitable to your congregation choose those you feel appropriate:

Hymn No.1

1. Once my world was ten miles round;
My neighbours lived next-door;
And I could live beyond the sound

ALTERNATIVE SUGGESTION FOR No.4 Come, Holy Spirit, Come -tune Franconia by Joseph König.

The following is another hymn which can be used if and where it is felt to be appropriate. The music is that of Jacob's ladder. To be sung solemnly at first but with increasing tempo and joyfulness.

Word of God for Us Today
