My dear Bronghton,

From last letter by the
"Penguin" & the "Thomas"
"Hutchinson" are received. The
letter first, on the 22nd July; - the
former on 13th Aug; & I need not
add how grievously distressed I
was at the news they conveyed.
Still I will hope that either Mr
Morris's Property may be liable
to the Demand of the Institution

last. The amt. of money collected
by Gilbert & myself for the Sunday
School, is £315.2. He has,
I think, sent out £200 to you, but
by what he would show us.
He has collected by our work 115.2.
& I have in hand about £10.2.
I am collecting & hope to get something
more. I have read the Sydney Paper
of 22 March last. The Balance of
your account to this time is about £100
in your favor. I have just drawn for
£50 dividend, but shall not carry this
to the account. I shall have been
in the 20th perhaps before, then
will communicate with him. ✓

I greatly as this business troubles
me, I will yet not be cast down,
but trust in a good Providence
to deliver you from this
trouble, as it appears to me
to be unlike the others.

That your Property can
be available. If so, it is the
most important & admirable thing
possible. I have seen nothing
more with whom I have heard from
him. We are all well - also all
at Canterbury, as well as all friends
as relations here.
