

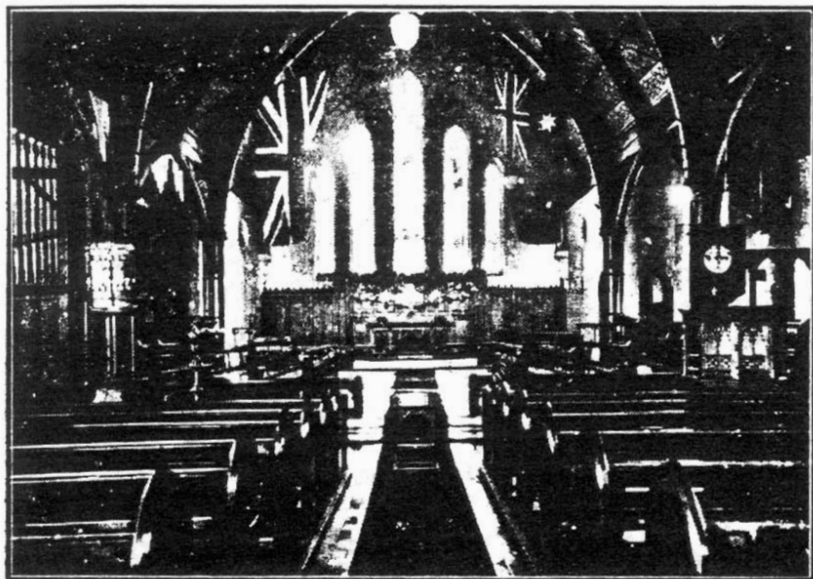

Dear Friends,

May I take this opportunity to thank you, one and all, for your prayers, your visits, your greetings, and your telephone calls whilst I have been in hospital and during this rather prolonged convalescence. I have been greatly moved by your concern and kindness.

This has not been a very easy time for Helen, the boys and myself for there has been a lot of uncertainty both about the complaint and also in the treatment. Unfortunately many of the problems are still not solved.

To be put into hospital for a serious illness that you didn't know one had and to be ordered complete bed rest when one feels reasonably able to cope has all been very unsettling.

I hope that at the end of June I will be able to resume some duties. It may require some help taking services and doing other things but lets hope and pray towards this. Your prayers are earnestly desired.

When I was in hospital I was saddened to hear of Frank Hearn's death. Our deepest sympathy goes out to his widow Edith and Michele, Peter, Sarah and Emma.

Frank's passing was very sudden. We shall miss him greatly from our congregation as he was such an active member. In fact he had been up at the church attending to something only hours before his death. Again we extend sympathy to the family and a large circle of friends.

As Frank was one of our People's Wardens we will need to hold a Vestry meeting on order to elect a successor. I believe that a meeting is planned for Sunday 10th

July following the morning service. All adult communicant members of our congregation are urged to attend.

Please make this a matter of prayer.

Finally I must express my encouragement to all those who have and are still taking part in the Operation Good News '88. It is a wonderful idea that the Christian churches of Australia combine to make the gift of a New Testament to all Australian households. What better gift to our neighbours in this Bi-centennial year.

A big thanks to all those who have organized this distribution. They have my heartfelt thanks, as do all those who took part. I am sure you have found it a great blessing.

100 YEARS OF BEACH MISSIONS

Sunday, March marked the 100th anniversary of Scripture Union Beach Missions in Australia. The first beach services were led by Rev. W. A. Clayton on Manly Beach in January and February 1888.

This year Scripture Union NSW had seventy teams, comprising 2800 volunteers conducting Family Missions in coastal resorts and inland towns the length and breadth of the State. Members of the movement gathered for a commemorative service of thanksgiving at Manly on Sunday afternoon.

Early in the afternoon volunteers constructed a traditional "beach pulpit" as the focus for proceedings. Across the front were the words "Jesus is Lord".

The activity began at 3-30 with children gathering from all parts of the beach for a sand modelling contest. Groups of four and five worked feverishly to produce models that varied from a sphinx, to a whale, and even a representation of an ancient oil lamp, the Scripture Union symbol for the lamp of truth, the Bible.

Organisers gave thanks to God as the rain held off and several "ladies and gentlemen" in Victorian costume gathered a crowd of several hundred for worship. The music was led by two trumpeters, six accordionists and a portable pedal organ, played by Mr. Colin Davies, a veteran of many beach missions.

Owen Shelley recalled a theme used at a Manly service in 1901, when he spoke on the messages carried by flags. On a mast beside the pulpit, naval signal flags stood out in the stiff breeze repeating the message Jesus is Lord. Behind them, as if to reinforce the setting an empty tanker rolled at anchor in the swell, carrying flags fore and aft. Mr. Shelley challenged the

crowd to "seek a pilot" for their lives, looking to the Lord Jesus to guide them "to a safe harbour".

Later in the evening St. Matthew's Anglican church was the centre of thanksgiving worship. The speaker, Dr. Bill Anderson, Principal of Morling Baptist Theological College, paid special tribute to the people of Manly, and St. Matthew's in particular, for their contribution to Christian mission work down through the years.
