**MINUTES OF COUNCIL MEETING held at 222 Pitt Street, Sydney, Monday, 21 June, 1999**

**OPENING:** The President, Rev. Elizabeth Walker, welcomed everyone and opened the meeting with a reading from Matthew's Gospel, Ch. 10:24, followed by a Prayer of praise and thanksgiving for many blessings; of confession for our sins; and intercession for Christ's Church in all the world.

**PRESENT:** 41 as recorded. A welcome was extended to new members: Roman Catholic - Daphne Peterson (State President of CWL), Mary Melville, Joyce Fren/Margo Nancarrow who will share attendance; Churches of Christ - Noelene Roose (National Liaison for World Day of Prayer, Jean Porteous, and Elaine Wilson; Anglican - Dorothy Kenning.

**APOLOGIES:** Major Glenys Holley, Marie McCann, Elaine Wilson, Mina Whybourne and 14 as recorded.

**MINUTES:** \*\* The Minutes of the Annual General Meeting, 19 April, 1999, were read and initialled and the following corrections noted: Elsie Cox represents Churches of Christ, not Congregational; Judith Cayzer's name to be deleted from Social Issues C'tee. \* It was noted, with thanks, that Ruth Moore has agreed to take the position of Stock Secretary. \* Brig. Ruth Smith requested replacement as delegate to the World Day of Prayer C'tee. The President thanked Ruth for representing ACW for 20 years at WDP and assured her that Council would follow up her request. \* Re Newsette Manager: Marie Majoor asked to be relieved of the preparation of mailing lists for Newsette; computer skills necessary to run off labels. Volunteer sought.

\*\* Minutes of Council Meeting of 19 April were read and confirmed on the motion of Lily Hanlon and Helen Hill.

**BUSINESS ARISING** from meetings of Council (19 April) and Executive (7 June):

1. **ANNUAL SERVICE OF DEDICATION:** It was agreed that a very happy, well-organised day was enjoyed by all; that the act of dedication was most meaningful; the soloist was excellent; and that the opportunity to meet the National President was appreciated after hearing her challenging message. Joan Tong recommended that in the future, attention should be given to greater publicity by all denominations and suggested that a flyer be printed for distribution.
2. **ECUMENICAL LUNCHEON:** Plans well in hand for Monday 19 July at Salvation Army HQ at 11 am. Invitations need to be handed out and publicity given.
3. **ANNUAL REPORT:** Ready for distribution, thanks to Joan Tong.
4. **ACW NATIONAL CONFERENCE:** Brisbane, 27 Sept.-1 Oct. Registration forms available. Members encouraged to attend. It was noted that the Secretary of FLC International, Esther Byu, would be present. Council ratified reg. Accommodation and Air fare for President and Secretary (delegates). Marie Majoor and Heather Reid will be Observers; Executive members attending: Shirley Wells and Mina Whybourne.
5. **ACW (NSW) HISTORY:** Marie Majoor has matter in hand.
6. **OZINDO PROJECT:** Photos from Fiona and Mia in letter from Adelaide (after cycling 2,000 k) advising that \$12,000 had been raised in the first two months of their journey to assist needy Indonesian families. Members were encouraged to support the girls; financial assistance forms still available.

7. NATIONAL COUNCIL OF WOMEN - NCW AWARD AND FOUNDATION DAY LUNCHEON: 17 August, President to attend. Members were delighted to hear that Beryl McLaughlin had been nominated by WCTU for the Award and that ACW had written supporting the nomination.

REPORTS:

The Treasurer: Marie Majoor reported finances in order and it was moved, seconded and agreed that cheques for payment be passed.

ACWC: Joan Tong, referring to the Conference in Chiang Mai, reminded members of the Scriptures in Luke 4:16-19 and Isaiah 61 pertaining to the Conference Theme, REJOICE (in our Gospel), RECLAIM (our right as Christian people to spread the Gospel challenge) and RESPOND (to work with the challenge). Joan was sure that the strongest way they were challenged at the Conference was through the Bible Studies, and she gave details of the wonderful leadership at those studies.

Pleasant Sunday Afternoon, 31 October at 3 pm at Campsie Salvation Army; plans well in hand and it is hoped that Philippino and Korean singers as well as the Salvation Army band from Campsie along with Chinese young people with tambourines, will perform. Members were reminded to publicise this function.

Calendars: Now available for all at \$8 (RRP \$10). Further supply (including the Chris Huber art) will be distributed at the Ecumenical Luncheon.

Publicity: Members were asked to pass on to Glenys Holley any article concerning ACW seen printed in their denomination's papers, and to let Glenys know if there were any media organisations in their denominations which have not been contacted.

Newsette: Deadline for items for next edition - 12 July.

Functions: Everything in hand for Ecumenical Luncheon, 19 July at 11 am in Salvation Army HQ; bookings necessary by 5 July.

Membership/Pastoral Care: Heather Badgery informed members that Dorothy Lumb is now in Hostel Care at Nuffield Village, Castle Hill; card had been sent to Edith Ridge who is making better progress now; Thora Thomas is in good spirits but needs continued prayer as she faces radio-therapy five days a week for six weeks. Thora is hoping to come in to the Council meeting after treatment today.

WKS: \* A fax received from Edith showed that the three young women whose names were submitted by NSW, viz Lt. Lyn Edge, Mrs Santine Lelange-Haan and Pastor Rowena Curtis, had all returned their application forms for the year 2000 Scholarship and it now remains for the Trustees to make their decision

\* It was noted that Mina Whybourne had received a letter from Rachel McManus thanking NSW Unit for continued prayers and saying that she had enrolled in a TAFE Welfare Studies course. Rachel has announced her engagement and is planning her wedding in October. Mina has sent congratulations on our behalf.

\* It was heard, with pleasure, that the EXODUS FOUNDATION has been approved as the project to receive part of the World Community Day 1999 offering.

FLC: Shirley Wells reported that an application for the 1999 Grant had been received from Rev. Cliff Letcher, President of Australian Indigenous Ministries, seeking \$6,000 for the Bible College Computer Project at Humpty Doo, NT. This College is a training institution designed to train aboriginal Christians to minister to their communities and churches. The major focus of the training programme is to develop leadership in the context of sound Biblical teaching.

A video was shown which gave insight into the running of the residential schools on the property at Humpty Doo. Shirley read from Circle of Prayer – Voice from Italy. (3)

**PRESIDENT'S BUSINESS:** Rev. Elizabeth Walker welcomed Thora Thomas who had been able to call in on her way home from medical treatment. Thora spoke briefly to the meeting, thanking members for the mantle of prayer of which she was constantly aware. The President then sought ratification of the suggestion that Life Membership be conferred on Edith Ridge - moved Shirley Wells, seconded Thora Thomas, carried. It was resolved that the ceremony should take place on the occasion of the Ecumenical Luncheon on 19 July.

**CORRESPONDENCE:** The Secretary was congratulated on her handling of the large volume of correspondence. Members were encouraged to query any of the items on the list. (Correspondence listed at end of Minutes, pp 3 & 4).

\* Marie Majoor referred to ACWC Partners explaining, for the benefit of new members, that the practice of asking for \$1 per year from members originated years ago for the purpose of helping Asian women to attend the Conference, following the realisation that these women had been unable to attend a Conference to be held in Australia because of lack of funds. It was agreed that the Fellowship Day Service would be an ideal occasion on which to publicise ACWC Partners.

\* The President thanked the Churches of Christ ladies for preparing morning tea and the Baptist ladies for attending to the chairs.

\* Members were reminded that there will be no Council meeting in July as it is in that month that the Fellowship Day Service is held.

\* At the next meeting of Council, 16 August, Mrs Julie Breckenreg of Girls' Brigade will be our Guest Speaker.

\* Morning tea will be provided by Anglican ladies and the Church of Christ members will attend to the chairs.

**CLOSE:** There being no further business, the meeting closed with the Benediction at 12.20 pm.
