Report of National Committee Meeting

Mrs Daugherty introduced and congratulated Mrs Mitchell who is now ^{of International Council of Women of Australia} convenor of the International Relations & Peace Ctee & the report on Constitutional Change.

(a) There will now be biennial meetings of N.C.M. next meeting August 1975 Adelaide. The financial year will be from July to June.

(b) Postal Ballot.

(c) Working Committee - will be composed of the same no of Personnel.

(d) Travel Pool Each state to pay equal amount delegates fares to be paid from Central Pool.

(e) Scribal Pool - Tales to continue to help travel Pool - when present stocks depleted stocks to be replenished how. Scribal + profits to go to Working Ctee after deduction of handling expenses.

Cost of Asian Conference - replies to be received by 30th June 1974.

The President addressed Deaconess Andrew to report on the spiritual aspects of N.C.M.

The aims of A.C.W. which are to unite Christian Women in loving service of the Lord Jesus Christ.

This is happening especially with renewed friendship and fellowship the Roman Catholic and Baptist women. Deacons are now able to attend N.C.M. though the Baptist women have not applied for affiliation.

② Promoting to operate of Men & Women in Society

This project seems to have collapsed as far as ACC but let us continue with effect to claim "The Kingdom is yours". Let us claim live and work as Christian People by providing opportunities for worship on Special Days. World Community Day Services were criticised. The next service is to be produced by Working Bee will be less structured and the theme aligned to World Action Projects.

③ To Encourage Fellowship & Service across International Boundaries

The new Humphred Reit Scholar miss Myung Rae Song has not yet arrived from Korea. 1975 Scholar is to be selected from Africa applicants.

④ F.L.C. New prayer Booklets with Australian title
have been rejected - New Guide of prayers Booklets will soon be arriving

⑤ F.L.C Allocations: Redfern Aboriginal Centre has been submitted as the only recommended project from Australia for this year.

⑥ East Asia Cheeek Mission Conference, Bangkok
Oct 1974. Thanks were expressed to Mr Badger (NSW) at N. Q.M. for all his efforts in this area. Australia's representatives will be Mr Gay Smith SA, Mr Rachel Cox (Qld) Overseers will be Mr Maisie

McLennan (^{downs}) Mr Elkin Montague an Aboriginal Church Woman from Moagow Mission W.A. Mrs Daugerty spoke at this stage of the obstacles encountered over the years at attempts by N.S.W N.I.C.E to obtain an Aboriginal Woman Representative Deaconess ^{Andrews} concluded by informing us that ^{A.C.W.} Mrs Starkey will be our overseas liaison correspondent, past N.N. Declaras Correspondent

Queensland reports to N.C.M were welcomed at this stage by Mrs Daugerty who presented them with a goodwill card, which was circulated at the meeting for signatures.

Mrs Connell, Mrs Haigh thanked laurail for their welcome & Mrs Connell alerted us to the need to send very well informed council members to N.C.M. and that they be truly representative at council level. Mrs Carmel agreed with Deaconess Andrews that the Working Bee seems to have a conflict of Conceptions regarding their responsibilities. Mrs Daugerty reported that the opportunity given for Panel Discussion ad the acting out of Patriarchal gave an opportunity for released fellowship in a very intercultural Committee meeting.
