Holy Baptism is administered in the Parish Church every Wednesday evening at 7.15 and on the second Sunday in each month at 4.15 p.m. If these times are inconvenient the service will be held on *any* Sunday afternoon, if notice be given before hand. The rule of the Church, as prescribed in the Prayer Book, is that for every male child there shall be two Godfathers and one Godmother, and for every female, one Godfather and two Godmothers. Parents are allowed to stand as sponsors for their own children, and by thus doing add to their relation of natural parentage that of suretyship to the Church for the spiritual welfare of the child. In all cases the attendance of the father at the service is desired. There is no fee or charge for baptism, but is free to all. At the Churching or thanksgiving service (which need not of necessity be held at the same time as baptism) it is customary for the mother to make a voluntary thank-offering.

All Saints' Cricket Club.—A social gathering was held in the School Hall on Monday evening, 14th June. An enjoyable programme of music, etc., was rendered, during which the Rector presented the trophies to the following members: E.H. Dean, bowling; H.E. Calver, batting; J.M. Boyle, G.R. Asprey, W.L. Anniversary of the Consecration of All Saints'.—Special services will be held at the Parish Church on Sunday, August 15th, being the sixth anniversary of its consecration. The names of the select preachers at these services will be announced in our next issue.

Parochial Pleasant Evening.—The time is again approaching for our annual tea meeting which is to be held in connection with the anniversary of the consecration of the Church. The first meeting of ladies and gentlemen to make preliminary arrangements will be held in the Vestry on Wednesday evening, July 7th, at 8.15, immediately after Evensong. It is earnestly hoped that there may be a good attendance, as the presence of those who are willing to help saves the necessity for much labour of writing and visiting.

Church of England Men's Society.—On Tuesday, June the first those who had already given in their names were formally admitted to membership, and the All Saints' branch became an established fact. The next monthly meeting will be held on Tuesday, July 6th, in the School Hall, at 8 o'clock, when the subject for discussion will be "The attitude of men to their Church, some problems and solutions." Churchmen are invited to attend, and will be welcomed by the clergy and members of the society.

Men's Meetings.—Under the auspices of the Church of England Men's Society a series of "Winter Evenings for Men" has been arranged. On Tuesday last a most interesting lecture on English Cathedrals, illustrated with capital lantern views was given by Rev. P. C. Anderson. Unfortunately the night was very wet, but the unexpectedly large number of men who attended were rewarded with a great treat, and asked Mr. Anderson to come again and continue the subject. The corporate Communion of members has been arranged for Sunday, July 11th, at 8 a.m. The meetings this month will be held on TUESDAY, 13TH, when Mr. H. F. Esmond will give some scientific talk, illustrated with experiments, and on TUESDAY, 27TH, Mr. Jas. Hole, who has often delighted us before, will give a series of literary selections.

The committee hope that their efforts on behalf of their fellow churchmen will be appreciated by a large attendance at these meetings, for which there is no fee or ticket of admission.

Holy Communion.—On Sunday, July 11th, the first corporate attendance the C. of E. Men's Society has been arranged for, when the members will be present, we hope accompanied by some of the members of their families.

The Confirmees will make their first communion at the early celebration on Sunday, 18th July, at which it is hoped that there will be a large number of communicants to welcome the young people to the Lord's Table.

Church Lads' Brigade.—On Friday, 18th June, the officers and lads of the Brigade held a "Pound Night." There was a good attendance of parents of the lads and their friends to give a welcome home to Captain and Mrs. Wills after their holiday. The Rector presided and spoke of the pleasure it afforded them all to see their guests in such good health and hoped that the Brigade would increase and improve during the winter season. At a later stage a pair of gold sleeve-links was presented by Rev. W. A. Fletcher, on behalf of the company, to Lieut. Timewell in token of the high appreciation in which he was held by his fellow officers and the lads under his command.

Parochial Day School.—The usual mid-winter Breaking-up Concert was given on June 25th when the School Hall was crowded to the doors. Our thanks are due to the ladies and gentlemen who kindly gave their talented services to add to the programme, and pretty songs were sung by the scholars. The School re-opens on Monday July 5th when new scholars will be enrolled.

A Confirmation was held in All Saints' Church on Sunday afternoon, June 20, at 3 p.m., by the Right Rev. Bishop Stone-Wigg, formerly of New Guinea. The service was a very impressive one, and its solemnity was deepened by the Bishop's earnest address, and the answer renewing the Baptismal vow being given by each candidate, separately, in response to the Bishop's question. The Bishop confirmed 29 males and 26 females, laying his hand on the head of each candidate severally. At the close of the service the Bishop held a private confirmation at the house of Clarence Farrell, a cripple confined to his bed, who received the sacred rite, after private preparation by the clergy.
