7.45 a.m.—Holy Communion,

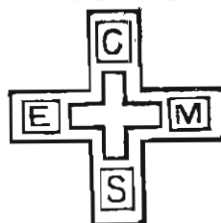
11.0 a.m.—Mattins and Holy Communion,

C. E. M. S.—At the last monthly meeting, after the usual business, a most interesting address on "Service" was given by Mr. Walter Newell of the Marrickville Branch. Members who were present much regretted that there were not a larger attendance of their fellow-Churchmen. The Committee has met during the month and arranged an interesting programme for the monthly meetings and adopted a suggestion for visitation of men by the members, each taking one name for the purpose of such visitation. The Committee desire it to be known that they most gladly invite to their meetings on the second Monday in each month any of their fellow-Churchmen, who are assured of a cordial welcome. The next meeting will be held on Monday 11th October in the Vestry of All Saints' Church.

All Saints' Parochial Fund Home Boxes.—The Churchwardens desire to acknowledge the assistance afforded to the Church funds by those parishioners who consent to have the boxes in their homes. The sum of £15 appears in this quarter's account, being the amount contained in the 85 boxes which have been sent in or have been collected by the District Visitors. The boxes are convenient for the reception of small donations at regular intervals such as a penny daily or sixpence weekly, and are used by some parishioners as a means of giving their Church offertory when wet weather or other circumstances prevent their attendance at Church. If ALL OUR FELLOW-PARISHIONERS would kindly take a box and use it in these ways, your financial difficulties would easily be overcome, and no one would feel any severe burden in supporting the funds of their Church.

All Saints' Parochial Pleasant Evening—our annual Social Tea and Entertainment—was held at the Town Hall on Tuesday 14th September and was fully up to the standard of former years both in the excellency of provision and entertainment and in the attendance of parishioners. Much interest was evinced in the letter which the Rector read, in the course of his address, from one of our boys written in the trenches at The Dardanelles and narrating how he and others had been building a little Church in which the Dean of Sydney had held Services, and also the forming of a graveyard. The financial result was very helpful to the Wardens in meeting the payment due on the Rectory Building Debt.

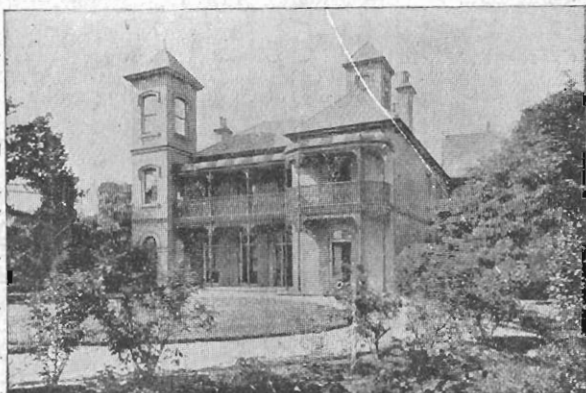
