**Christmas Services.**—The Festival of the Nativity was observed in the customary manner at both Churches, large congregations worshipping at the Morning Services, the Choral Evensong at the Parish Church however, not being so well attended as in previous years owing, no doubt to the extreme heat. The Churches were tastefully decorated by willing workers, and notwithstanding the fact of Christmas Eve falling on Sunday and of the very hot weather which has been prevailing, both our Churches presented a very pleasing appearance. A very large number of worshippers communicated at the Celebrations of Holy Communion, and the figures compare very favorably with those of previous years. The Rector preached at the Morning Service at half-past-ten, and Rev. S. J. Woolnough who had been assisting at the Parish Church all day, preached at Evensong. We very much regret that Mr. Woolnough is shortly removing from our midst, and we here place on record our very high appreciation of his kindly help rendered in the Services of the Church and in the Sunday School.

**All Saints' Sunday School.**—The Distribution of Prizes took place on Wednesday, 13th December. After addresses and a musical program a number of prizes were presented to those who obtained the required marks for the year. The Rector announced with regret that Miss P. Haviland who had been for many years the Hon. Secretary of the Girls' School and in numerous other ways a most helpful and loyal Churchworker was, with her sisters, leaving the district for Manly, and therefore relinquishing her secretaryship. Miss E. J. Hogg and Miss Tate then presented to Miss Haviland, on behalf of the Sunday School and friends, an address accompanied by a purse of sovereigns. In the removal of the Misses Haviland the parish will sustain a great loss in the ranks of its most enthusiastic and dependable workers.

**All Saints' Mission Church.**—The last services at our branch Church which has been known as All Saints' Mission Church since its establishment over twenty years ago, were held on the last Sunday in the year; there was Celebration of Holy Communion at 7.45, and Mattins and Evensong, the Rector preaching at the former and the Curate at the latter. There were large congregations during the day especially at the last service, and the total collections for the day nearly reached £6. We were very pleased to see at the services our esteemed Churchwarden and old Churchworker Mr. H.G. Norman who is just recovering from a very serious operation.

**St. Augustine's Church.**—The new School-Church which is to take the place of the old Mission Church will be opened by the Archbishop at 3.15 on Saturday 6th January, the Festival of the Epiphany. The Service will consist of a Form of Dedication followed by Evensong; there will be a collection in aid of the Building Fund. The regular Sunday Services will be held on the following day with a Children's Service in the afternoon. In the future the Evening Service will be held at 7.15 throughout the year at the new Church, not at 7.30 as hitherto. The early service of Holy Communion on the third Sunday of the month will be held at 7.45 throughout the year. For the present, Sunday School will be held in the afternoon only at 3.15, there will be a regular Children's Service on the third Sunday at 3.15, Holy Baptism at 4.15. Members of the Church of England attending the new Church, who are not known to the Clergy, are kindly asked to leave their names and addresses so that an opportunity may be given of visiting them.

**Canons of St. Andrew's Cathedral.**—His Grace the Archbishop has appointed Rev. R. E. Goddard one of the Honorary Canons of the Cathedral. The Rector desires to acknowledge with sincere thanks the many letters of congratulation which it has been a pleasant surprise to receive.

**C. E. M. S.**—The monthly meeting was held on the second Monday as usual, when a very interesting discussion took place on the subject of Church Finance. After this meeting a Devotional Service was held in the Church followed by a Service of Admission. We have received an addition to our membership in the advent to our parish of Mr. Williams who was latterly the President of the C. E. M. S. at Juneau. Our membership is gradually increasing: some half-a-dozen workers will be initiated at our next Service. On Christmas Eve an Open-air Service was held in Leichhardt Park by the combined Branches of Leichhardt, Petersham, Rozelle, Annandale and Haberfield. Over 500 persons were present; addresses were given by Rev. H. S. Begbie, the Provincial Secretaries (Messrs Molesworth and Wilgoss) and Mr. Palmer, a recent arrival from the Rev. Watts Ditchfield's Parish of St. James, the Less, Bethual Green. The Service was most gratifying, and it is hoped another will be held shortly, this time nearer home.

**Parochial Day School.**—A successful Concert was held on December 5 when a large audience gathered in the Town Hall and shewed keen appreciation of the children's entertainment, "Princess of Poppyland". The prizes were distributed in the School Hall on December 22 when the Rector presided, and Mr. Cusiter presented the awards to the successful scholars. Dorothy Leatheam won the gold medal, and Willie Dyason obtained the highest prize in the boys' division. The pupils presented Miss Green with a handsome hand-mirror as a mark of their appreciation and good wishes. Miss Green desires, through the Parish Paper, to thank those parishioners who took tickets, and the ladies and ex-pupils who willingly gave of their ability to make the Concert a success; also to the friends who kindly gave prizes:—the Rector and Mrs Goddard (3 for Holy Scripture), A. E. Jaques Esq. (gold medal), Mrs Willis, Mrs Cusiter, Mrs Cape (2), Miss Cape (2), Mrs A dye Collins, Mrs P. Hordern (2), Mrs Seale (2), Mrs Shuttleworth, Mrs J. J. Cohen, Mrs Middleton, Miss A. R. Hogg, Miss Barnett, Mrs Clapham and Mrs Glanville. The School is now on slightly altered conditions, and to those parents wishing close attention being given to thier children an opportunity is offered; for English education, fee 1/- week or 10/6 quarter for one in a family, and /9 week or 8/- quarter for two in a family, with further reduction for more. A kindergarten has been introduced for infants. Special subjects by visiting Teachers:— Drawing, Elocution and Physical Culture, 5/- quarter; Painting, 10/- quarter; Language and other subjects can be arranged for. The School re-opens on January 22 when new scholars will be enrolled.

**Mission Church Sunday School.**—At the Distribution of Prizes on December 15, an address and a set of robes were presented to Mr. W. Hilliard who had been successively scholar, teacher and superintendent of the School, and who was about to be ordained by the Archbishop. The Rector referred in the highest terms to Mr. Hilliard's valuable work in the School and assured him that his friends of the Mission Church would follow his future career with prayerful interest.
