A LETTER FROM THE CHURCHWARDENS

Fellow Parishioners,

It was with great pleasure that we learned that the Rev. T. E. Champion had accepted nomination as Rector of All Saints', Petersham. The reverend gentleman has a fine record of service for the Church, covering New Zealand as well as Australia. During the Second Great War the Rev. T. E. Champion was a Chaplain with the New Zealand Forces overseas. The Institution and Induction of our new Rector will take place in the Parish Church on Tuesday, the 27th March, commencing at 8 p.m., and we feel sure that all parishioners will join with him in prayer in this important service. After the service you will have an opportunity of meeting the Rev. T. E. Champion, his wife and family, and we feel sure that the people of our Parish will co-operate in every way with our new Rector and thus help him in his ministry and at the same time make him happy in his association with All Saints' people. We feel confident that Mrs. Champion and her family will soon feel "at home" with our parishioners.

We cannot over-emphasise the importance of Church attendance, and it would be appreciated if you will endeavour to interest all Anglicans of our Parish in this matter. We express the hope that parishioners will attend one or more of the Services set down for Good Friday and for Easter Day. Details are set out in this issue of the "Chronicle."

His Grace the Archbishop has appointed the Rev. S. V. Satchell to be Acting-Rector of our Parish until the arrival of our new Rector. Mr. Satchell will, however, not be available at the Rectory during week days.
