MINUTES OF COUNCIL MEETING held at 222 PITT STREET, SYDNEY on MONDAY
16TH AUGUST, 1999 at 10 a.m.

OPENING: President Elizabeth Walker welcomed members and for Devotions read from Matthew's Gospel, Chapter 15:21-28 - the first recording of Jesus being approached by a foreign woman, a Canaanite, for healing for her daughter. Through her faith, her daughter was healed by Jesus - his ministry was beyond the bounds of Israel. Elizabeth prayed for our members and their families, that God would use us in our organisation and that He would direct and guide our meeting.

PRESENT: 32 as recorded. A welcome was extended to new members - Elaine Wilson of the Churches of Christ and Dorothy Kenning, Anglican.

APOLOGIES: Major Joan Tong, Major Glenys Holley, Heather Reid, Peg Blake. and 13 as recorded.

President Elizabeth welcomed Mrs Julie Brackenreg from The Girls Brigade and invited her to speak on the history, aims, etc. of the Girls Brigade. The Brigade established in Ireland in 1893 and England in 1902 and now world wide - Girls Brigade International. It is inter-denominational and its aim is to help girls become followers of Christ. There is an International President and International Management Committee. Julie is responsible for the Pacific Area - Relevant literature was distributed and is available for members' information. Julie was thanked for bringing to our attention the work and outreach undertaken by the Girls' Brigade particularly in some of the under-developed countries.

MINUTES - of Council Meeting of 21st June, 1999 were read and confirmed on the motion of Jean Porteous and Joyce Liddell. Carried.

2. **INTERFAITH DIALOGUE** - Following a suggestion from the Catholic members that we hold an Interfaith Dialogue, Sister Marie Craddock outlined some of the possibilities - a meeting with Sister Pauline Rae or Sister Tric Madigan as speakers. Some discussion followed and it was moved Beryl McLaughlin seconded Beryl Kirkwood that we explore further the possibility of an Interfaith Dialogue - Executive to bring for decision next Council meeting. Carried.
3. **LISA JACKSON** - was to arrive in Geneva today (16th August) for World Council of Churches meeting - she was very appreciative of our assistance with her fare (approved by Council members at Ecumenical Luncheon).
4. **WORLD DAY OF PRAYER COMMITTEE** - Bev Elliott would consider filling this vacancy.
5. **OZINDO PROJECT** - \$105 donated at Ec. Luncheon paid to Uniting Church for Fiona. Fiona due to arrive in Darwin 16th (today).
6. **WELCOME HOME** luncheon at Parliament House on 29th November - NCW in conjunction with Soroptimist Intl NSW) Details later from NCW.

7. FLOWER FESTIVAL - St. Mary's Cathedral - 3rd-6th September - Peg Blake to attend official opening. Flyers available for distribution.
8. NATIONAL CONFERENCE - Three of our late members are to be entered in the Bursary Book. Marie McCann read the Entry for Leah Pickering, Joyce Liddell the entry for Brigadier Mabel Ward and Mina Whybourne the entry for Doris Mitchell.

National Executive wish to increase the Executive by two - Social Issues and Publicity.
Proposed change to the Constitution re membership will be discussed.

A Forum is being held on Wednesday 13th October 1999 at Parliament House to discuss issues of concern for Older Persons in NSW towards a society for all ages and all cultural backgrounds. A large attendance would help to advance comments from the Forum.
The continuation of IYOP will be the Platform for Action (for 3 years) if there is sufficient interest. Partners such as ourselves will be asked to contribute.
