THE RECTOR'S LETTER

All Saints' Rectory,

29th August, 1952.

Dear People of All Saints',

After much wet, unsettled weather, we were singularly fortunate in having perfect weather conditions for our Consecration Festival. It is with a deep sense of gratitude to Almighty God we record yet another happy and successful Festival; and we are indeed grateful to ALL who assisted in making it so, particularly to our Choirmaster and the members of our Choir whose good work in the service of praise contributed greatly to the inspiration of the services. The congregations were very good indeed, especially the morning, which was a Family Service. So encouraged are we at the response that we propose having a regular Family Service on the first Sunday morning in each month at eleven o'clock. As many families are at present away for the school holidays, we shall commence on Sunday, October 5th. I am indebted to the Sunday School staff for its co-operation in this matter. We were happy to welcome to our Festival services the Rev. W. S. Childs (N.S.W. Secretary of the Australian Board of Missions), and the Rev. O. V. Abram (Rector of St. Jude's, Randwick): the former assisted me at the early Celebration and the latter was the occasional preacher in the evening. Thanks also to our friends who brought gifts of arm lilies, and to Miss E. Olofsson and Mrs. Adams, who arranged them so artistically.

The Churchwardens join me in thanking most sincerely ALL parishioners and friends for their generous response to the Special Appeal, which, to date, amounts to £193/16/1. There are nine boxes still outstanding and possibly there are some envelopes yet to be returned. The Wardens will be grateful if you will bring or send them in as soon as possible.


The high standard of our annual Parish Festival Tea (organised by the Women's Guild) was well maintained. The Hall looked most attractive when all was in readiness, with its 13 tables laden with good things, and decorated with orange Iceland poppies (the gift of Mr. and Mrs. Bullman), which were arranged by Mrs. Morris in her usual skilful, attractive way. After tea Mr. Eagar was assisted by Mrs. F. Gunner and Miss J. Ditchburn in an enjoyable musical recital in Church preceding Evensong; after which an attractive concert programme was presented, which included Mrs. F. Gunner, Mrs. B. Sayers, Miss Margaret Moore, Mr. William Diamond, Mr. Walter Jagger and the ever-welcome "Weirdo."

At the conclusion of the programme, the Rector's Warden, in reporting the progress of the Special Appeal, thanked those who responded to it; and the Rector voiced our appreciation of the willing co-operation and generous gifts of all who contributed to the success of the 1952 Festival.

Next year will mark the fiftieth anniversary of the Consecration, and the suggestion has been made that we should make an "all out" effort to wipe out the Parish Hall debt. This would mean that the boxes would have to be issued much earlier than usual; but given the co-operation and support of all our people, we believe it could be done.

The lasting value of our Festival will be the measure of the inspiration and encouragement we gained to go forward to attempt greater things for Christ and His Church. This essential Christian Church is a great and glorious heritage into which we have entered. Others have laboured and we now enter into their labours. It is ours to fulfil the sacred trust they have committed into our hands. It is ours to guard the treasure, and to hand it on even greater and better than we found it.
