Her prayer was genuine, she meant it and God answered. She told us that she was completely freed from her addiction and through Christian friends was taught about Jesus. She has been restored to her family and her friends, but especially she has been restored to God's friendship through forgiveness in Jesus Christ who died for her and rose again through the power of God, to open up eternity for all who repent and turn back to God in confession and faith. Guilt is real but guilt may be forgiven. We are all guilty before God. We come short of His standard. We should not be too proud to admit this. For if we confess our sins they will be forgiven for Jesus Christ's sake. This is not mere theory but those who put it to the test find it true.
