**Dear Friends,**

**Over the next twelve months there will be a number of changes both in the parish and in the diocese.**

**On Monday 24th February at 7-30pm we will be holding our Annual Vestry Meeting. This is the time when we elect our Churchwardens and Parish Council as well as receiving the reports of activities for the past year.**

**One of our wardens, Liam Bathgate has indicated he will not be available this year as he will by then have moved to Turramurra. We will miss him, his wife Jeannie and the family. Liam has been able to bring some new insights into our parish life which have been very helpful.**

**At the end of June I will be taking holidays and six months long service leave prior to retirement. By the end of February 1993 I shall have clocked-up some thirty five years in the ministry, most of it in Sydney Diocese and a couple of years in North West Australia with the Bush Church Aid Society.**

**Arrangements have already been made with the Rev Walter Collier to act as the locum tenens during this period. Mr. Collier is a recently retired clergyman who has been looking after St. Alban's Five Dock for several years. I'm sure he will bring a freshness and a caring ministry to our parish and I am certain that his ministry will be greatly appreciated.**

**Lastly, the Archbishop reaches retiring age this October. This is a major change for any diocese. The new archbishop will be elected early in 1993, but we should be prayerfully considering this matter now.**

Following the successful coach trips last year and the year before we are planning another this year.

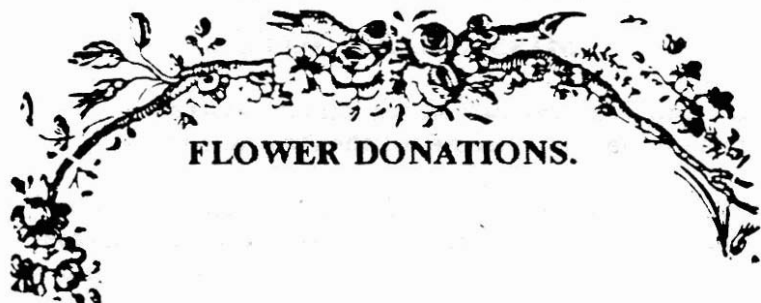
We are off to Katoomba and the Blue Mountains on Saturday 29th February.

## **MISSIONARY NOTES.**

**On Sunday 2nd February two clergy will be consecrated bishops in services held at extremes of the Australian continent.**

**In a service in St. Andrew's Cathedral, Sydney the Rev Peter Dawson will be made a bishop to serve in one of the Anglican dioceses in eastern Zaire. Peter grew up in St. Peter's Cook's River and was educated at Newtown Tech, now Newtown High. He has been a missionary in Tanganyika and recently was rector of Shellharbour, near Wollongong.**

**The rector has an interest in this congregation as he trained with Peter Dawson at Moore College and was then catechist at Cook's River. The rector's father also taught Peter at Newtown Tech High.**

**On the same day but in Western Australia the Rev Tony Nichols will also be consecrated a bishop. He will become Bishop of North Western Australia. This follows the retirement of Bishop Ged Muston in the middle of last year.**

**Tony Nichols has had wide experience especially in missionary work in Australia and overseas. He was Principal of Nungallinya College in Darwin, he was in Indonesia for some years and recently has been Principal of St. Andrew's Hall in Melbourne. In both positions in Darwin and Melbourne he has been involved in training aboriginals and others for missionary work.**

**The Diocese of North Western Australia is largely supported by the Bush Church Aid Society and the society will be represented at the consecration by the General Secretary. This will be one of the last visits that the Rev Ernie Carnaby will be making to the West as general Secretary of BCA. He resigns at the end of February to return to parish work as Rector of St. James' Turramurra.**

**We need to be in prayer for these newly consecrated bishops, for the immediate past General Secretary of BCA and for the choice of a successor to the Rev Ernie Carnaby.**
