

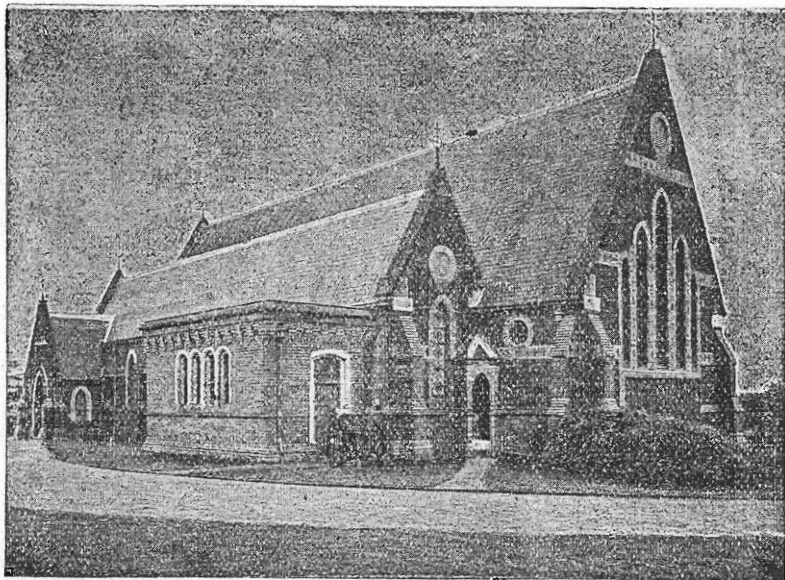

MOTTO FOR THE YEAR.

“As for me and my house, we will serve the LORD.”

A Special Service for Men was held on Sunday, December 6th, when nearly seventy were present, and much interest was shewn. A very simple and short form of service was held, including well known hymns, which were heartily sung by the congregation, in the absence of the choir. The Rector gave a practical address on Conscience, which he prefaced by saying that this was the initiation of a forward movement by the men of the Church themselves, which he trusted would be received in good part by those who were not regular worshippers, and that eventually its effect would be to make the religion of Jesus Christ a more potent factor in the daily life of the men of the place.

The next service will be held on Sunday afternoon, January 18th, at a quarter past four, when the Rector will give an address.

Young Men's Bible Class.—The Rev. W. A. Fletcher will conduct a class for young men on Sunday afternoons, from two o'clock until three, in the class room of All Saints' School Hall, beginning on Sunday, January 10th. The class is intended for the young men of the Mission Church and of the Parish Church. Any new residents who are not yet attached to either church are cordially invited.

The Christmas Service at both Churches were well attended, though a large number of the regular worshippers were away from home. How strangely modern customs and modes of life are changing the old-time home keeping and home-coming fashion of observing the Christmas season! We earnestly bid the large number of communicants who attend only at such times as Christmas and Easter to a more regular and frequent attendance at the Holy Communion; it is a good practice to fix upon a certain Sunday or Sundays in each month, and to endeavour not to let them pass without obeying the Lord's command, and seeking His grace through His appointed ordinance. We earnestly command this practice, and urge our communicants to observe it during the coming year.

Sittings in All Saints' Church.—The Wardens desire it to be known that, in consequence of the recent removal of many parishioners, there are now vacant sittings in the alternate seats that are let in the Church. These will be available from January 1st, and can be allotted on application to the Wardens (one of whom may be seen after any of the Sunday services), or to the Verg' r. The rent is five shillings per quarter each sitting.

The Parochial Day School.—The annual distribution of prizes took place on Monday, Dec. 21st, the prizes being kindly presented by Rev L. Parr. The dux of the school again was Fannie Leatham, but as she received the gold medal last year, was ineligible this year, so was awarded a gold brooch, and the medal was awarded to Lassie Brooks, who came second in class marks. We are indebted to several parishioners, who very kindly gave prizes, and Miss Green, for herself and on behalf of the school desires, in this way, to acknowledge her thanks for this kindness and interest shown in the school, the Rector and Mrs. Goddard three prizes for Holy Scripture; A. E. Jaques, Esq., gold medal; Mrs. Percy Hordern, two Girls' Annual; Mrs. Williamson, senr., prize for drawing; Mrs. A. J. Gaston, for needlework; Mrs. Palmer, for needlework; Mrs. Johnston (Stanmore) for needlework; Master Arthur Johnston, for physical culture; Mrs. R. C. Wills, drawing; Mrs. J. J. Cohen, silver medal for elocution; Mrs. Glanville, silver medal for elocution; Miss Armstrong, silver medal for physical culture; Mrs. Cusiter, for homework, and Miss A. R. Hogg for elocution.
