

A.C.W. WORKING COMMITTEE MINUTES Friday, 16th May, 1969 (2).

REPORTS: Fellowship of the Least Coin:
Mrs Strack reported that the demand for Circle of Prayer Vol. III was still very strong and a further 270 had been ordered. Leaflets had been sent to Mrs Thompson (S.A.O) and Mrs Butler (N.S.W.) Mrs Butler had indicated that she would like 1000 copies of the 'Gift of Prayer' (This is the allocation sheet of gifts made by F.L.C. between 1958-68.) It was resolved to order a further 5,000 copies. Mrs Strack drew the attention of the Committee to the need for producing a new Leaflet re the Fellowship of the Least Coin. This to be considered later. Discussion had taken place with the Victorian Convener on the production of a leaflet answering questions on the project. This would be considered further.

Publications: Mrs Rogers reported that she had filled the orders for Fellowship Day Service as they were received. Thanks are expressed to the S.A.W.I.C.C. who have made this service much better known this year in S.A.

United Churches: In the absence of Mrs Faichney Deaconess Mc Kechie reported that she had been in touch with the various United Churches and consideration was being given to the possibility of the Churches meeting together. It was hoped that more could be done if Mrs Faichney is able to meet with members later this year. Mrs Burton reported that she had made contact with some members during her visit to Darwin. Ball Point Pens had been left with Darwin ladies.

Ball Point Pens: In the absence of Mrs Saunders consideration was given to ordering 5,000 pens as it had been awkward not having pens to fulfil orders placed. It was decided to order 5,000 pens subject to a price check with Scribal Pens.

NATIONAL COMMITTEE MEETING 1970: As the reply from Mr Brown concerning the Annual Meeting of A.C.C. had indicated that no Meeting would be held in 1970 consideration was given to A.C.W. National Committee Meeting. It was indicated that A.C.C. intended holding a Consultation in February, 1970 but this would probably be of a specialist nature and no venue had been decided. It was resolved that the National Committee Meeting be held in Melbourne at St Hilda's College from Tuesday, February 3rd to Friday February 6th, and that the National Committee Meeting consider the place and time of the meeting for 1971. The decision to meet at St Hilda's was subject to confirmation by the College Council. The President, Treasurer and Secretary were asked to form a sub-committee to report back to the next meeting on plans for the National Committee Meeting.

BROCHURE: As reported in Correspondence Deaconess Ritchie to follow this matter up.

WINIFRED KIEK SCHOLARSHIP COMMITTEE: It was decided that Mrs Burton and the President would meet on June 3rd and report to next meeting.

NEXT MEETING: June 20th, 1969, at 10 a.m. It was resolved to meet in August on the second Friday, 8th August as the President would be absent on the third Friday.
