Parochial Day School.—The Annual Concert took place on Friday evening, 10th December, in the Petersham Town Hall, at which there was a very large gathering. An interesting and enjoyable programme by the pupils was rendered, at the close of which a hearty vote of thanks was accorded to Miss Green and her assistants for the evening's entertainment.

On Monday, 20th December, the Presentation of Prizes took place by Mrs. Percy Hordern, in the absence of the Rector, R. C. Wills, Esq. very kindly presiding. We were glad to see so many of the parents and parishioners present, many of whom remained to partake of a social cup of tea. Miss Green wishes to take this opportunity of expressing her sincere thanks to those who so kindly gave prizes in the School, viz:— The Rector and Mrs. Goddard, A. E. Jaques, Esq. (gold medal), Mrs. Wills, Mrs. Cusiter, Mrs. P. Hordern, Mrs. Gaston, Mrs. Cape, Mrs. Williamson, Mrs. Johnston and Master A. Johnston (Scanmore,) Mrs. Palmer, Mrs. J. J. Cohen, Miss A. R. Hogg, Miss Barnett, Miss Glanville, Miss Armstrong. It is very gratifying to receive these gifts and to accept them as proofs of interest in the Parochial Day School, which, it is hoped is doing useful and lasting work.

School re-opens on Monday, 17th January.

C.E.M.S.—Great hopes are entertained throughout the Diocese of the influence that will be exercised by this Society of which branches have been formed in many Parishes since the visit of the Rev. H. S. Woolcombe. A large Diocesan Council has been formed of which a small Executive Committee is the working body. An office has been opened in Vickery's Chambers, Pitt Street, and plans are being made for a vigorous year's work. Our own Parochial branch is one of the strongest in number of members and is represented both on the Council and Executive. If each member fulfils his pledge of prayer and service the result will soon be felt in many ways and notably in the presence and more-regular attendance of men at the Services of the Church—more especially at the Holy Communion. There are two fixtures for this month:—

- (1) The C.E.M.S. Corporate Communion on Sunday, 9th January, at 7.30 a.m.
- (2) A Social Evening in the School Hall on Monday, 24th January, at 8 p.m.

All Saints' Church.—The Churchwardens find it necessary to undertake certain necessary repairs to the fabric of the Church. The recent heavy rain has found many weak spots in the main roof, which must be attended to, and has shewn that the Choir Vestry must be completely re-roofed at once. The paint on all the external doors has quite perished as well as on the large notice board and must now, at length, be seen to. Damp has produced discoloration of some parts of the interior walls, and although the internal renovation is not so imperative as the external, yet it is highly desirable that it should be undertaken if the state of the funds would permit, but, unfortunately, the accounts published in this paper shew that there is a deficit of over £50, which however, the Wardens hope will be soon reduced by additional subscriptions to the General Church Fund.

The Young Men's Bible Class is held at the Parish Church every Sunday afternoon at 2.15 o'clock. The class meets in the church for hymn, prayer and reading of scripture, and then adjourns to the Vestry for the instruction. A course of lessons on the outlines of the history of the Church of England is being given, and the class is over at 3 o'clock, thus giving members the opportunity of having the greater part of the afternoon free. Mr. Fletcher, who conducts the class, will be pleased to welcome young men any Sunday afternoon, and he will be glad to see the old members who have not been attending for some time, back again. He would also urge present and intending members to be regular in their attendance in order to gain the full benefit of the class.

All Saints' Sunday School.—The presentation of prizes to the scholars took place in the School Hall on Sunday afternoon, 19th December, when there was a large gathering of scholars and a goodly number of parents present. The Rector presided, and after addresses, the prizes were presented to the successful scholars by Mr. T. Kirkby, the late Superintendent. The opportunity was taken by the teachers and scholars of presenting to Mr. Kirkby, who was resigning the position of Superintendent after 16 years' service, an illuminated address and marble clock, in recognition of his faithful work. The Rector, on behalf of the teachers and scholars, also bade farewell to Mr. F. A. Collier, our late energetic and enthusiastic Secretary, who has had to sever his connection with the Church and School, by reason of his family's removal to Croydon. Mr. A. Johnston has been appointed Secretary in his place. We are glad to say that three members of the C.E.M.S. have volunteered their services as teachers and thus we have started the new year with teachers for all the classes.

All Saints' Choir.—As we were going to press for last month's issue, a social gathering was tendered in the School Hall on 25th November by members of the Choir to the Choirmaster and Mrs. and Misses Wood, in recognition of their long services to the Choir. The Rector and Mrs. Goddard and many of the old members of the Choir were present. During the evening Mr. T. Kirkby, the oldest

member of the Choir, presented Mr. Wood with a handsomely illuminated address recording his twenty years' service as Choirmaster, and Mr. J. H. Kinnings presented Mrs. and Misses Wood with a framed address and appropriate gifts. The Rector spoke of Mr. Wood's long and regular services as Choirmaster, after which Mr. Wood feelingly responded. The remainder of the evening was spent with music, etc., after which refreshments were handed round, and the gathering terminated by singing "Auld Lang Syne."
