All Saints' Jubilee Memorial.—At its first meeting the new Council recommended that vigorous action should be taken to carry out the resolution of the parishioners at the meeting in the Town Hall last August, that a new fence and gates should be erected as a memorial of the Jubilee. The Wardens will at once take steps to bring the matter forward in the hope that work may be started before the Anniversary.

The Parish Fair or Bazaar.—A meeting will be held in the Rectory at 3 p.m. on Wednesday 24th May when the members of the Ladies' Handiwork Society and all ladies who are willing to help in preparation for the Bazaar to be held in the Spring, are cordially invited to attend.

— VESTRY MEETINGS —

PARISH CHURCH.—The Annual Vestry Meeting was held in the School Hall on Monday evening 24th April. The Rector presided, and there was a fair gathering of gentlemen present. The Chairman briefly outlined the chief parochial events of the past year, and the Wardens presented their accounts which, owing to the recent response to their special appeal, showed a credit balance of £6-6-6. The retiring Church-wardens Messrs Wills, Cusiter and Austin were re-elected, and the other Officers for the ensuing year whose names appear on the first page of this Paper were appointed. Votes of thanks were passed to the Church-workers including the Wardens, the Council, Men's Visiting Committee, the Lady-District-Visitors, Ladies' Handiwork Society, the Choir, Sunday School Teachers, Church Decorators etc. Consideration was given to the Jubilee Memorial, and the Church Council was instructed to bring the matter before parishioners with a view to renewed interest and activity.

MISSION CHURCH.—The Vestry Meeting was held on Tuesday 25th April under the presidency of the Rector. The Church-wardens' account showed a credit balance of £30-3-2, and the meeting showed its confidence in them by re-electing them as Wardens for the ensuing year. After the Vestry Meeting, the first meeting of the new Council was held which devoted almost the whole of its time to the question of making preparations for the erection of the new School Church in Albany Road, which it is hoped will soon be started.

All Saints' Sunday School.—The Teachers have decided to hold an Excursion to The Avenue, Lane Cove, on Saturday 27th May when they hope for the presence of parents and friends of the Scholars and others.

"Heralds of the King"—This Young People's Auxiliary in connection with the A.B.M. has been started in this parish and meets in the School Hall at 3 o'clock on the first Saturday afternoon of each month. We hope to speak more of this organisation in a later issue.
