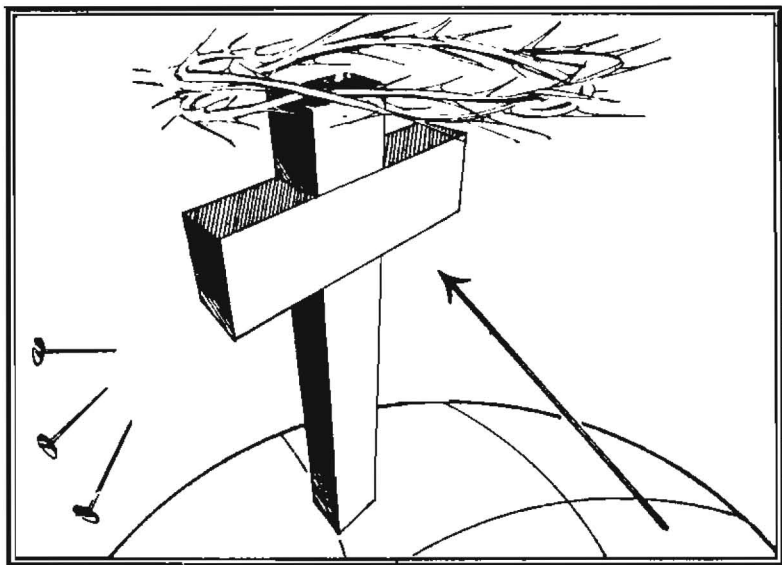

What is happiness?

One of the striking things about happiness to which Jesus refers in the Sermon on the Mount is that it is open for anyone to discover.

Here Jesus is different from any other religious teacher. Aristotle, the Greek philosopher, taught the happy life was open only to certain classes of people; it was not for slaves, for the diseased, for the dying or for the young. What a horrible kind of religion!

Buddha said a man cannot find happiness unless he gets rid of his own self - not merely his sinful self, but of the things that make real human life interesting. Only if he empties himself of all worldly desire in body and mind and puts in its place heavenly desire, will he find true and lasting happiness.

Other teachers have asserted that we must avoid pain and suffering and shrink from humiliation; and then if we are lucky we will be happy. Not so with Jesus. In the Sermon on the Mount He urges us actively to meet life, giving ourselves to it - but in the right way.

If a man does this, keeping his eyes fixed on what is really worth aiming at, and then trying to achieve it, he will find not necessarily material success.

but a personal life of character which is really
"happy". He will win respect from his fellow
men, and above all the approval of God.

The religion of Jesus is free for all. He has no
favourites. No one is debarred from discovering
the happiness His way of life offers.

Through the centuries people have displayed many different signs to show they are disciples of Christ. The more common ones have been - the fish, the dove and the cross. Of course there is nothing intrinsically wrong with any of these. There is, however, a much better sign. One that is universal, one that will endure till Christ's return.

That sign is . . . Love.

Jesus says "A new commandment I give to you, that your love one another... by this all men will know that you are my disciples, if you have love for one another."

These are familiar enough words. Notice, though, what is being said. Jesus is giving a command which includes a condition. An "if" is involved. If you are obedient you will wear the sign Jesus gave. Since it is a command, though, it can be violated. The point is this: it is possible to be a disciple without showing the sign, but if we expect non-Christians to know that we are Christians, we must show the sign.

In effect, Jesus is turning to the world and saying: "I've got something to say to you. On the basis of my authority, I give you a right: you may judge whether or not a individual is my disciple on the basis of the love that person shows to all Christians."

That's pretty scary! It's a reminder, though, of how important Love is. As far as Jesus is concerned, love is a priority. Such a priority that he gave it as a sign for us to wear before the world. How important is it then that we love! That we show love to our brothers and sisters in the midst of our differences - great or small - loving them when it costs us something, loving them under times of tremendous emotional tension. loving in a way that the world can see.
