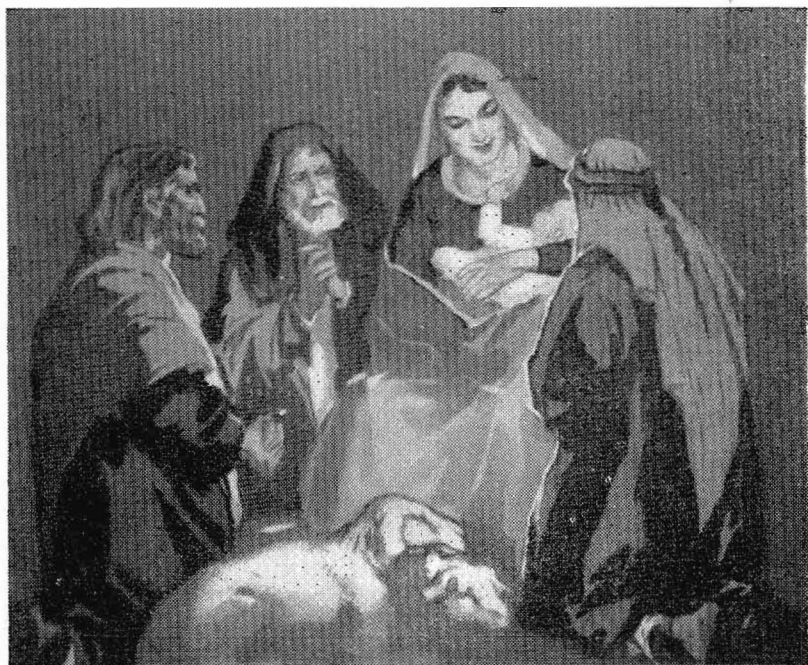

MORE RECORDS BROKEN

Report of our Greatest Fete

You can never be anything but amazed at the fantastic success of our Annual Fetes. They seem to go on reaping greater totals every year.

These continually increasing figures are without doubt due to the many devoted workers who toil, not only on the day of the Fete, but also throughout the year making goods and preparations for the great day. The thanks of the Church and all parishioners of All Saints' must accordingly go out to all who helped in any way at all to raise this record of £1,558. Indeed, it will need a lot of thought, preparation and work to beat that amount next year.

The proceeds will be used for extra maintenance that cannot be met from our offertories (which are gradually declining), and for such special projects as the renewal of the vestry roof and church floor, and the installation of amplifiers inside the Church. A proportion of the proceeds must also be sent to the Diocesan authorities, as indeed is the case with all the other parish income.

General expenses such as advertising, entertainers etc. will also be met from this amount.

Mrs. Bosward says a very sincere thank you to the ladies who

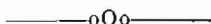
helped on her stall, to those who helped with sewing and gift parcels, and to all who helped in any way towards a very successful day.

1965 CONFIRMATION

Bishop A. J. Dain administered the Sacred Rite of Confirmation to 14 candidates from All Saints' on Thursday, 4th November. Candidates from our neighbouring parish of St. Augustine's, Stanmore were presented at this same service by their Rector, the Rev. J. McDonald.

The Bishop, making his first visit to us, gave an inspiring address to the confirmees, based on the text from II. Timothy, Chapter I, Verse 7. He pointed out how important it was for the Candidates to accept for themselves the vows previously taken for them by their Godparents and was confident that our prayers for the confirmees were being answered.

The Bishop went on to explain how the newly confirmed would find a reality of experience in life under three headings. First, through the work of the Holy Spirit, the things of God would be revealed to them and the strength gained through this Holy Spirit would enable us to face the opposition abounding in the world today.

Second, through the Holy Spirit the love of God comes to us. This love is a means of spurring us on to accept work for God in return, such as service on the mission fields. Finally, as St. Paul says, the Holy Spirit is also the spirit of self-control. There are many problems for teenagers in the world today that cannot be met by their own strength or will, but which the Holy Ghost can overcome for us, if we call upon Him.

We can all build up our life with God by attending Church regularly, and by taking the sacraments, and so secure the strength of the Holy Spirit to help us in our daily lives.
