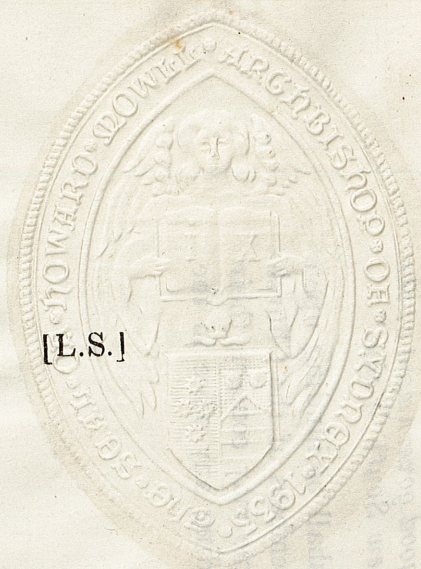
From "Sydney Church Ordinance (1912)."

"17. No person shall be permitted to celebrate Divine Service, administer the Sacraments, perform any other Rite or Ordinance of the Church of England, or preach any Sermon in any Church unless he be first licensed or approved by the Archbishop."

EXTRACT.

From "Constitutions for the management and good government of the Church of England within the State of New South Wales."

"3. * * * All Ordinances of the Synod shall be binding upon the Bishop and his successors and all other members of the Church within the Diocese but only so far as the same may concern their respective rights duties and liabilities as holding any office in the said Church within the Diocese."

To our beloved in Christ STEPHEN TAYLOR -----Clerk B.A.

Greeting, We do by these Presents give and grant unto you, in whose fidelity, morals, learning, sound doctrine, and diligence We do fully confide, our License and Authority to perform the Office of RECTOR in the Church of Saint Stephen, at Mittagong, with the parish annexed, in the County of Camden -----

within our Diocese and Jurisdiction, in reading the Common Prayers, and performing other Ecclesiastical Duties belonging to the said Office, according to the form prescribed in the Book of Common Prayer made and published by authority of Parliament, and the Canons and Constitutions in that behalf lawfully established and promulgated, and not otherwise, or in any other manner; (you having duly made and subscribed such Declaration, and taken and subscribed such Oaths, as are required by law to be subscribed, made, and taken.)

AND WE DO by these presents assign to you, in addition to such Stipend, allowance, or advantage, as may be lawfully annexed to the said Office, all such Fees, commonly called Surplice Fees, as are authorised and allowed by us, and duly recorded in our Registry at Sydney.

AND WE require and appoint that you reside in the Rectory annexed to the said Church.

GIVEN under the Seal of the See of Sydney which in this behalf is used this FIRST ----- day of OCTOBER -- in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and thirty-five and of our Consecration the fourteenth, and third ---- of our Translation.
