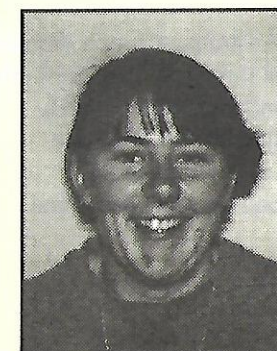

THE WINIFRED KIEK SCHOLARSHIP (WKS)

This Scholarship is available to Christian women from multicultural Australia, Pacific Island Nations and member countries of Asian Church Women's Conference who already have basic training in a chosen field of work.

It provides the opportunity for further theological training to better equip the scholar to provide leadership in her own country, church and community. The scholarship covers fares, tuition fees and accommodation and is awarded annually.

When it is deemed more appropriate the Scholarship Funds may be used for designated educational or charitable projects for women through the National Council of Churches of Australia World Christian Service.

FUNDS - FELLOWSHIP DAY

The offerings received at the Australian Church Women Fellowship Day Services, held throughout Australia in July each year, are invested, and the interest used to finance the scholarship. Additional donations are encouraged and may be made at any time to the Winifred Kiek Scholarship Fund through your State Unit Treasurer.

1997 SCHOLARSHIP

Rachael McManus

Rachael attended Wauchope High School in northern New South Wales, where she completed her secondary studies & attained her Year 12 Certificate. In 1995 she completed an Associate Diploma in Social Science (Youth Work) at Kempsey College of TAFE, and has attended a number of workshops on such topics as Court Support, Suicide Prevention and Foster Care.

At present Rachael is living in Sydney and studying at the Anglican Youth Department/ Robert Menzies School of Christian Studies. Her Winifred Kiek Scholarship will assist her in this course in 1997.

Since discovering her Aboriginal heritage two years ago, Rachael is keen to work among Aboriginal young people. At the conclusion of her course she expects to be involved in the establishment of a project to work with young Aboriginal women through the South Sydney Anglican Mission Team.

Joanne Harries

Joanne completed her studies at the Salvation Army Training College in January 1994 and commenced a joint ministry with her husband David. At present they are based in Launceston, Tasmania.

Joanne is currently working towards a Bachelor of Theology Degree through Whitley College in Melbourne. Her degree will be accredited through the Melbourne College of Divinity.

Her Winifred Kiek Scholarship will enable her to take part in a two week intensive course at Whitley and be sponsored for a further twenty week correspondence course.

THE WKS TRUSTEES

The Trustees of the Scholarship, located in Adelaide, are responsible for investing funds and acting as an advisory body to the National Executive of Australian Church Women.

WINIFRED KIEK FELLOWSHIP

At the discretion of the Trustees, in consultation with the National Executive, funds will be made available (on a predetermined basis) to invite a representative from the following bodies:-Asian Church Women's Conference; The Pacific Council of Churches; Past Winifred Kiek Scholars; The Fellowship of the Least Coin International Committee; Church Women United Aotearoa/ NZ; or a noted Christian woman leader: to attend the National Conference of Australian Church Women and visit State/Territory Units. An outstanding Christian woman visiting Australia at any other time may be invited to visit State/Territory Units under such a Fellowship.

AUSTRALIAN CHURCH WOMEN BURSARY BOOK

You are invited to nominate a Christian woman whose association with the work of Australian Church Women is noteworthy.

Donations are invited and the interest earned from the invested monies is used to provide a book grant to current Scholarship holders.

A profile and photograph of the woman so honoured is then recorded in the Bursary Book, held by the National WKS Convenor.
